School Improvements

There will be several projects happening during the summer holidays to improve the experience for students in September, most notably the extension to our canteen which will enable more students to sit and eat inside during the winter months in particular.

We are also building a new bike shed near the Science block so that students do not have too far to walk from the front gate. Should a student wish to cycle to school, their bike must be roadworthy and a lock should be provided. We strongly encourage students to wear a cycle helmet. The site itself is a no cycle zone and students must dismount at the gate and walk their bikes to the closest bike shed. Those not following these rules will not be permitted to cycle to Latimer.

SAFEGUARDING

Safeguarding: Online Safety vs Wellbeing

You may have read that the Government is actively considering placing restrictions on the time that young people spend on social media (<u>Social media time limits for children considered by</u> <u>government - BBC News</u>). This follows earlier measures that the previous Government introduced and are going through parliament right now (<u>Online Safety Bill: Crackdown on harmful social media content agreed - BBC News</u>) to tighten up on social media apps.

Here at Latimer we are also reviewing this with some further changes planned to our mobile phone policy in readiness for September. More to follow in a letter which will come out in July.

I spend much of my time talking to students about staying safe online (not talking to strangers, not giving out passwords, not accessing websites they shouldn't be etc), but how much do we speak to students and young people about online wellbeing. What is a healthy amount of time to be on their phones?

We are moving to a point where school may be the only time that young people are stopped from accessing their phones. These 6.5 hours in a day might be the only time students accept restrictions on using their phone. I wouldn't want to lecture parents about how to manage phone use at home but if I were asked for my advice, it would be to encourage play and being outside where possible. To promote dialogue and dare I say good old fashioned (bad) habits e.g TV and cinema! Even playing Fortnite on the X Box is arguably less harmful than scrolling through potentially inappropriate Tiktoks! (Is gaming good for kids? - BBC Bitesize)

To summarise, as we approach the summer holidays, I would urge young people to get off their phones and get outside. I worked out recently the only place where you can guarantee that your child won't use their phone is in a swimming pool! 6 weeks of swimming every day might be difficult to achieve, but trying to find ways of promoting activities that avoid phone use will of course help their own mental health and wellbeing!

For students studying vocational subjects (e.g. BTEC), staff may request attendance for additional coursework catch-up sessions where necessary. These sessions have been arranged directly with the relevant teaching staff and communication has been sent home to parents/carers.

Work Experience Week 30th June to 4th July

As soon as the Year 12 mock exams are complete, students will begin a valuable week of work experience. This opportunity is a crucial part of their personal and professional development, offering real-world insight beyond the classroom.

To support them in making the most of their placements, students attended a final assembly on Friday, where they received guidance on how to prepare, conduct themselves professionally, and maximise the learning potential of the week ahead.

Once placements are complete and students return to school, they will take part in a structured reflection and evaluation process. This will include preparing and delivering a presentation to their peers, allowing them to share their experiences, insights, and personal growth.

We look forward to hearing about the range of industries, skills, and stories that come from this important experience.



Our Year 11 into 12 Summer Induction Programme runs from Monday 23rd to Wednesday 25th June. Throughout the induction students will access taster lessons in each of their chosen subjects.

This will introduce them to some of the content of each subject; the types of skills required on the course and give them an idea of the challenges of a typical Level 3 lesson.

EYFS places are available at Cottingham C of E Primary School and Pytchley Endowed C of E Primary School.


