# **Learning and Progress**

#### Mock Exam Season Countdown...

Time is flying by and it will not be long before the Year 11 and 13 Mock Examination season commences (Wednesday 6 December - Thursday 21 December).

Specific details and student timetables will be issued soon and in the meantime students should be well under way with their revision programme.

A timetable of additional revision sessions will be published. These will occur both at lunchtimes and after school and we would be grateful if you would encourage your child to attend all relevant sessions.

We would encourage the students to be using the additional resources we have provided for them such as *PiXL Maths App, Tassomai* for Science and *GCSEPod* for all other subjects. Information about these resources will be available for parents at the Year 11 SPRE.

### Year 9 and 10 GCSEs: Off to a flying start...

Following their Study Skills Workshop, Year 9 and 10 students have been issued with a sample of revision materials: some flashcards, a *'Plan, Do, Review'* template and some A3 paper for mind maps. Please encourage your child to access their school email account to pick up the resources electronically as well.

Now it is about sustaining the process of regularly creating revision material and developing the stamina to survive their GCSE studies: your child should be encouraged to create revision resources for topics as they move through their studies in each subject so they are not overwhelmed as their courses reach a conclusion at GCSE exam time. They know this, but your support and encouragement in reminding them would be greatly appreciated. Their mock exams will come round quickly!

### **Aspire: After School Study Support for Students**

This week sees the launch of our new after school study support 'ASPIRE' which replaces 'Homework Club'.



'ASPIRE' is located in the Learning Resource Centre (LRC) and IT3 and will now operate daily from 3.15 to 5.00pm. All students are welcome to come along for any sessions that they choose and enjoy a drink/snack before settling down to complete their homework. Two members of staff will lead the 'ASPIRE' sessions and provide assistance to students, as well as liaising with teachers to ensure students are receiving the best support possible.

IT3 will provide a silent study room with IT facilities. The LRC will provide a quiet space for students with non-IT based homework. Resources will be available to assist with completion of homework. For those students who have completed their work, we will be offering skills based additional learning, such as support with handwriting practice – essential skills needed for formal exams!

# Safeguarding Update

### **Evacuation and Lockdown Procedures**

It is difficult to accept that we are living in a climate of some uncertainty when it comes to public safety, but nonetheless, sadly this is the case.

As sensitive as it is, as a College, we want to ensure that we have equipped our students with the strategies to manage a situation where their personal safety might be at risk and so during this term, we will be addressing the 'Run, Hide, Tell' strategy within tutor time and assemblies. To ensure we approach this difficult topic sensitively and appropriately, we will be working closely with the PHSE association and the police National Counter Terrorism Security Office (NaCTSO).

We feel is it essential to inform our students of what to do in the unlikely event of such incidents, rather than shock them into thinking such attacks are likely or inevitable. By approaching this in both House assemblies and in tutor groups, it will allow students to be informed and discuss this with their teachers in a safe, age-appropriate and reassuring manner.

As part of this, we will also be informing students of two drills they must be aware of in the unlikely event of such incidents on the College site: these are a 'lock-down' and a 'complete evacuation'. Students will practise both of these processes in pre-planned drills towards the end of November.

#### **Promoting Positive Well-Being**

We are delighted to be able to offer a monthly drop-in session run by a Keyworker from the CAN Young People's Service. Students can access additional education and advice around drugs and alcohol. There will be a pop-up stand outside Student Services at lunchtime on 14<sup>th</sup> November to make students aware of the services on offer.

### 'All Different, All Equal': Anti-Bullying Week

To promote this year's National Anti-Bullying theme, 'All Different, All Equal', we will be running various tutor time activities for students to get involved in.

In addition to this, we have some incredible acts lined up for our 7th 'Latimer's Got Anti-Bullying Talent' contest, with heats next week and the final on Friday 24th November. Students who wish to be part of the audience can collect a ticket from Mrs Squires. The heats are free, however, for the final, we would be grateful if students could make a small donation on the door. The money raised will contribute towards further anti-bullying initiatives in the future.
