## Foundation Stage Scheme of Work

## Year 7 Term 6- Africa 11 Lessons

Aims: To develop students' understanding of the physical and human characteristics of the continent. Students will develop their geographical knowledge such as processes like desertification and different biomes through different locations in Africa. The topic is aimed to challenge students' frequent misconception that Africa is a country by teaching them about the similarities and differences between countries. Stereotypes will be challenged through the discussion of different backgrounds such as the wealthy. Students will use a range of resources including technology, maps, photos and books to develop their understanding of the continent. Students will investigate urban and rural landscapes, the lives of locals and Africa's place at a global scale.
