Year 9 Student Progress Review Evening (SPRE)

We would like to invite Year 9 students and their parents and carers to the SPRE on **Wednesday 21 March** from **5.30 – 8.30pm**.

We are keen to ensure that we work in partnership to secure the very best progress for your child: with this in mind, we would be grateful if your child could attend the evening with you so that in each subject there is a clear understanding of current progress and priority areas for improvement for both you and them.

Learning and Progress

For Year 11 and Year 13 we are almost there in terms of sitting vitally important exams! Both year groups should have clear plans for their revision programme over Easter. To help them with this we will be delivering some targeted revision sessions over the Easter break and individual letters with schedules on will be issued at the start of next week.

Year 11 'Maths Monday'

For Year 11, in Maths, we need parents and carers to be aware that every Tuesday from next week, students will be issued with a practice paper, uploaded to Show My Homework. Then, to support them with any areas that they identify as a gap, they are invited to attend 'Maths Monday', at lunchtime the following week, in the Maths Learning Centre. Please encourage your child to both complete the papers and attend the Monday session.

Revision Tools

We remind all parents and carers once again about the resources that students have at their disposal: their revision guides, GCSEPod, Tassomai Science and PiXL Apps for Maths, English, History and Geography. We would particularly ask you to encourage your child to revisit the Maths app which has been relaunched recently and now has very targeted questions based on tiers of entry.

Many teachers will have also recommended websites and YouTube channels that will be of use.











We have talked about partnerships during your child's time at the College and never more so will it be more important than now: your child will need support and encouragement from both you and the staff at the College over the coming weeks – please do not forget or underestimate the impact of small treats and rewards along the way!

Just launched: PiXL Timestables App Competition

This term we have launched a new app called PiXL Timestables for students of all years to use. It is an app that can be downloaded onto phones and tablets through the App Store and used on laptops via the website. It is perfect for short, sharp practice of timestables – an absolutely vital skill for all areas of maths and useful in everyday life!

In the app, students can choose a particular timestable to practise or try a mixture of 25 timed questions to earn trophies. Students can even play against other schools across the country in the speed challenge of Raft Run.


We have a leader board in the Maths department and there will be prizes at the end of term for the student who has earned the most points in the app.

Useful resources to support positive self-esteem in children

There is growing evidence that boys do care deeply about how they look, and it can be something that makes them feel bad. The 'Boys' Biggest Conversation' is a campaign to encourage teenagers and young men, across the UK, to talk about body image and the effect it has on their mental wellbeing. We will be discussing body image in tutor time and there are some great resources for parent/carers.

The 'Mindful Me' activity guide, developed with psychologists and experts in body image and girl development, helps girls build body confidence and self-esteem. The activities include a focus on body awareness, mindfulness, self-kindness, empowerment and positive emotion.

'Dove' has also created resources to support parents and carers in developing self-esteem in their children.

Aiming High: Raising Aspirations and Expectations

To build on this term's programme, we have further activities and events planned for Term 5 to support our students with making informed choices about their future pathways:

Year 8 will take part in a 'Money Matters' event, which aims to support students to increase their economic understanding.
