LATIMER CELEBRATES EXCELLENCE

We are absolutely delighted with the results the students in Years 11 and 13 have achieved. They have come through the disruption of recent years and shown immense resilience. Despite a return to pre-pandemic grading arrangements, the students have excelled.

Half of all students achieved a grade 5 or above in both English and Maths with more than 2/3 of students achieving grade 4 or above in both English and Maths. These are key qualifications for students' futures and we are so proud of their success. Students achieved an astonishing 60 grade 9s and 15 Distinction* grades across a variety of subjects including History, English Literature and Science, despite the National trend of fewer students achieving top grades.

A Level students overcame immense challenges and we are pleased to announce the very best examination results that we have ever delivered for our students, exceeding the comparable outcomes in 2019 and 2018 with 50% of all grades being A*-B and 76% of all grades being A*-C. We have seen an increase in A* grades from 2019 and 94% of students achieved Distinction/Distinction* in our vocational qualifications.



IMPORTANT NEWS

You may have seen recent media coverage regarding Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) and its use in educational settings. The Department for Education (DfE) has recently changed its guidance to education settings on the management of RAAC to take a more precautionary approach and as a result areas in affected spaces will be vacated. We wanted to inform you that we are not affected by this decision as we do not have RAAC in any of our buildings and therefore they will continue to function as normal.

BACK TO SCHOOL AND READY TO LEARN

A reminder that our start of the year College Information Pack for Parents and Carers, which can be found on the website, contains key 'need to know' information so that your child is well-prepared for the academic year ahead. In addition to this, we publish a Sixth Form Student Guide, also on the website, to support those who are joining us for post-16 studies.

We would also like to highlight the new aspects of the Satchel:one app, which will replace Epraise. This app is a crucial communication tool between the school and home, and in addition to extended learning tasks, you will now be able to view live updates on your child's behaviour, positive and negative, and information regarding any detentions. You can also see your child's timetable and attendance on the app.

By using the app, you can stay informed about your child's progress and conduct in school, enabling you to engage in meaningful conversations with your child about their academic journey. Furthermore, this app is not only for parents and carers; students can also download it to take responsibility for their behaviour and track their own progress.

We would also like to remind you of the following money saving support that Latimer can offer:

Financial Support: We can provide financial support for uniform for those students who are eligible for the Pupil Premium Funding. Please contact Ms Pankhania, Assistant Principal, if you would like to enquire if we can help you in this way: jpankhania@latimer.org.uk

Uniform Swap Shop: We have always had a uniform swap shop but it may be needed now more than ever. We have donated items that are in excellent condition (washed and ironed) waiting for a new home. Contacting You

As we start the new academic year, it is vital that we have up to date information about each student. Within the next few weeks, your child will be issued with a 'Personal Details' sheet for you to check and sign. When completing this form, please ensure you provide us with at least 2 relevant and up to date contacts. Can we please ask that those of you who have provided us details in the past check carefully that these details are still correct. It is important we have the right details if we need to contact you in an emergency.

Attendance

As a parent/carer you are legally responsible for making sure your child attends school regularly.

At Latimer we believe that every child is entitled to the same opportunities, including the educational benefits, social and emotional learning and belonging to their House and school.

It is important that you and your child develop a positive attitude to school attendance and punctuality so that they do not miss out on these opportunities. These qualities of reliability are also important in adult life.

Poor attendance disrupts a child's education. This causes a lack of continuity and progression in schoolwork and can establish patterns of behaviour which may lead to long-term truancy. Missing school prevents children from building essential learning blocks of skills and knowledge and prevents them from making educational links, leading to poor progression and anxiety.

We will work with parents/carers to identify barriers and seek provision from local partners to ensure the support is in place where necessary. Please see our **Policies** page on the website for full details of our Attendance Policy.

Contacting Us

Should you need to make urgent contact with your child during the College day, this should be done by contacting Student Services Reception.

It is not helpful if parents and carers contact their child during the school day via text messaging or calls to a mobile as we will confiscate mobile phones if seen and students will be placed in our daily detention.

Enrichment Activities Consent Form

In order for students to take part in enrichment activities, including clubs and fixtures taking place outside of the normal school day, we require parents and carers to complete a Consent Form. Did you know that just registering your child for Free School Meals means that the school gets extra money?

With this money we could give extra help to students who need it. If you are registered for Free School Meals you could also get help with things like music tuition, school trips or other out of school activities, or there could be help to allow your child to continue into the Sixth Form.

If you want your child to have a free, healthy meal at lunchtime that's great – they will get the free meal (saving you more than £400 a year). Even if you don't want the school meals, as long as you qualify and are registered, the school still gets the extra government funding.

No one will know you have registered and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming. Our cashless catering system ensures no other student knows who is receiving Free School Meals.
