In a week where we learnt to expect the unexpected, the sun was shining (quite unusual for this time of year!), the music was playing and the dancers were dancing their hearts out! So many students got involved whether it be beating the drums, tinkering on the piano or delivering 'flash mob' performances.

Both events captured the Latimer spirit: a happy and harmonious community coming together and demonstrated what Ofsted, earlier this year, recognised as an 'ethos which encourages pupils to aspire to achieve their potential, enjoy learning and to always try their best.'

We have seen so many winning performances this year. Although like the England football team we did not quite finish top of the world, like them we very nearly did! In the French Vocab Express competition, we were second in the world and the top school in Europe. We took on the whole of the United Kingdom on the PiXL Maths Timetable app and were the top school, with the man who designed and created the app conceding that our score was unlikely to ever be beaten!!

Well done and thank you to all of those students who have stood out for their contributions this year by having taken part in clubs, represented College teams, supported as volunteers, officials or as young leaders!

We have so many champions amongst us, but we have to make special mention of the success of our Year 10 boys' football team who won the Kettering League and District Cup and our Year 8 boys' football team who won the District League and County Cup. There was also athletics domination with both Year 8 boys' and girls' teams winning the district



championship and Year 7 boys and Year 9 boys also winning the District Championships. The Year 8 girls' rounders team ended the successful year winning the Year 8 district rounders tournament.

It has been an amazing year for **Vivos!** Our students have put such an increased effort in to their studies that we have awarded an astonishing **345,928!** 

We offer our congratulations to Latimer House who are the triumphant winners of this year's **House Competition** once again. Well done to Miss Milson as she gains her first victory as Achievement Leader.

## **Being Ready to Learn**

In order to be fully prepared for the start of the new academic year, please find attached our updated <u>College Information Pack for Parents and Carers</u> along with our <u>Behaviour for Learning Policy</u> and <u>Student Attendance</u> <u>Policy</u>. A reminder that our policies can also be found on the <u>Policies</u> page of our website.

To help us at the start of the year, please can you support with the following:

- **Trousers:** students should be wearing full length school trousers. The reason for this is that by its very nature a 'uniform' means that students should be dressed in the same way, with a lack of variation. Therefore, the following variations on this are **not permitted**: canvas trousers, jeans, chinos, leggings or legging style trousers, skin tight trousers and three-quarter length or ankle grazer trousers.
- **Jewellery:** students are permitted to wear two studs in each lobe of the ear and a watch. The following items are **not permitted**: nose, tongue, eye-brow or lip piercings, including clear bars; any earrings that are not in the lobe of the ear (such a cartilage or helix piercings); tapers and bars; rings, necklaces, bracelets and ankle bracelets
- **Shoes:** students should be wearing school shoes. The following variations on this are **not permitted**: canvas shoes and plimsolls; boots and any 'trainer' style shoes, including Vans.
- Chewing Gum: this causes so much damage and costs the College a disproportionate amount of money to address money that would be better spent on learning! Please do not allow your child to bring any chewing gum in to College.
- Mobile Phones: our policy has been amended to allow mobile phones. However, it is very clear that these should be switched off and in bags. Students are not permitted to store phones in blazer or trouser pockets. Any devices brought into College are done so at the owner's risk.

Please note that students who are not in correct uniform will be sent home to get changed.

#### **Electronic Front Gate**

In order to improve our safeguarding, from September we will be locking down the College site between 8.25 am and 3.15pm, with all three entrances being secured between these times. Any students or visitors to the site arriving after 8.25am will only be able to enter through controlled access at the Castle Way entrance, where an electronic gate will have been installed.

It is vital that your child arrives on time, that being at or before 8.25am. Those arriving after this time will not gain access to the site from the spinney gate or the Grosvenor Way entrance and, unless there is an acceptable reason, will also be deemed as late and will be placed in detention.
