Aspire: After School Study Support for Students



'ASPIRE' is located in the Learning Resource Centre (LRC) and IT3 and operates daily from 3.15 to 5.00 pm. All students are welcome to come along for any sessions that they choose and enjoy a drink/snack before settling down to complete their homework. Two members of staff lead the **'ASPIRE'** sessions and provide assistance to students, as well as liaising with teachers to ensure students are receiving the best support possible.

Resources are available to assist with completion of homework. For those students who have completed their work, we offer skills based additional learning, such as support with handwriting practice – essential skills needed for formal exams!
