Setting Goals for the New Academic Year

When talking to your young person about their goals for the new academic year, it is easy to give the impression that they are expected to know what their future career will be like. Instead keep in mind that the career goals they set now do **not** have to determine what they will do for the rest of their life! Career goals are best thought of as the **next steps** in their career journey. To avoid overwhelm encourage them to set goals that are **R**elevant, **A**chievable and **M**easurable (RAM).

Health and social care professions include medicine, allied healthcare, pharmacy, social policy and planning. It is a diverse sector with a large and growing number of vacancies in the South East Midlands.

Bedfordshire Health and Care Academy has been created and facilitated by Bedfordshire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust to provide students between the ages of 14 to 18 with a dynamic and flexible programme of learning for every individual that demonstrates an interest in pursuing a career in healthcare. The academy platform consists pre-recorded events, to deliver a programme comprised of role-play, simulation, demonstrations, behind the scenes tours and more.
