Year 11 Mock Exams

Year 11 have now had about 25% of their year before the start of their GCSE exams; the mock exams we will use to prepare them are fast approaching!

Students will receive their individual timetables in the coming weeks.

These mock exams are a vital tool in preparing for the real things! We would encourage students to use the **planning sheet** and the **topics for revision booklet** shared with them to start organising their revision. Advice and guidance can be found on the <u>school website</u>.

Mock exams are important for so many reasons:.

- They provide students with practice and the experience of exams
- They allow staff to reflect on how well they are doing and what we need to focus on in lessons
- They allow students to try out methods of revision
- Any revision carried out now will help students remember more for the real exams
- They are used in applications to Sixth Form and Colleges
- They will be kept by the school as evidence in case of any national issues around exams (this is related to the experience of Covid, they will not be used in individual circumstances)

However, these benefits are only there if students actually revise prior to the mocks and take these exams seriously.

As part of the exams process there may be days where exams finish before the end of the school day and students will be allowed to leave early – if this is an issue, please let us know. For those who get the bus, accommodation will be provided in school.

LITERACY NEWS

Literacy Extended Learning at Latimer: Year 7 and 8

Why Literacy?

Research overwhelmingly suggests that reading influences academic success, vocabulary development, mental health, the ability to empathise and knowledge of other cultures. As part of our ongoing commitment to literacy, Year 7 and 8 students have a fortnightly literacy lesson in the library where they access digital literacy improvement platforms: Bedrock Learning and Accelerated Reader. Bedrock Learning

Vocabulary knowledge plays a central role in reading comprehension; a student's ability to make sense of a text largely depends on their ability to understand the language used. Bedrock exposes students to a range of Tier 2 vocabulary through a variety of reading related activities.

As your child progresses through the Bedrock curriculum they will study hundreds of words, whilst reading fiction and non-fiction texts regularly. Bedrock forms part of the weekly extended learning programme set by your child's literacy teacher after their fortnightly literacy lesson.

We expect students to complete a minimum of 20 points per week, in addition to the 20 points they will achieve in their literacy lesson, totalling 60 points per fortnight (time is not monitored); achieving this will automatically enter them into the 'Bedrock Stars' prize draw (managed by Bedrock) where prizes include Amazon vouchers and even a Chromebook! We will also celebrate successes in school with certificates and house points as we monitor progress.

Accelerated Reader

Students should complete independent reading at home as well as in school to see progress and we recommend at least 15 minutes per day. Alongside Bedrock, your child will access Accelerated Reader, a computer programme that monitors reading practice and progress.

When students have finished reading a book of their choice, from within the recommended level based on an initial reading test, they will take an online quiz; passing the quiz is an indication that your child has understood what has been read. The rate at which a student completes quizzes will depend on their reading material and where a quiz has not been completed, the literacy teacher will check that your child is still making progress through a text.

Access in School

There are tablets available to access Bedrock and Accelerated Reader in the library between 8.00-8:25am and from 3.00-3:30pm every day as well as during break and lunchtimes. If you have any questions, please email: **rhawkins@latimer.org.uk** in the first instance.

We look forward to working with you as we continue to support literacy across the school.






CAREERS


Year 12 'Ace Level 3' Evening


