## Learning and Progress

### Ace Your Exams: “By failing to prepare, you are preparing to fail”

- **Mock Exams and Revision Support:** Thank you to those parents and carers who attended our rescheduled Year 11 ‘*Ace Your Exams*’ evening this week. To support this, we include an overview of our programme as we continue with the countdown to GCSEs.

And the clock is ticking, with only 3 school weeks left until the start of the mock exam season for Years 11 and 13. Time spent on revision over half term is essential. All details of the Year 11 schedule are outlined in the attached information sheet. Year 13 details will be finalised at the start of Term 2. We also thought that it would be helpful to include a copy of the Study Skills booklet that was issued to our students last year. This gives an overview of a number of revision strategies that they could use.

- **Sixth Form Mock Interviews:** To support Year 13 students with preparation for Post-18 routes, these interviews will take place on the evenings of Tuesday 13 November and Wednesday 14 November, with representatives from the world of work leading each interview. Students have participated in a workshop in advance to support with their completion of CVs and have used the Unifrog platform to prepare and write a personal statement on [www.unifrog.org](http://www.unifrog.org)
- **Sixth Form Bursary:** The 16 to 19 Bursary Fund provides financial support to help students overcome specific barriers to participation. There are two bursaries available: discretionary bursary awards which can be made to students who face financial barriers in education and a vulnerable bursary for young people in a defined vulnerable group.
