Year 13 University Applications Deadline

This is the UCAS 'equal consideration' deadline, which means course providers must consider all applications received by this time equally.

Don't Miss the Deadline 29th January 2025 Gpm

Universities and colleges do not have to consider applications received after the deadline, although they can if they have spaces available, once the on-time applications have been considered.

To all those students still busy working on their applications, please remember that you need to "Pay and Send" using a debit/credit card. Don't worry your application will not actually go off to UCAS at this point.

After you have paid, you will need to sit with a member of the Sixth Form team who will fully check through your whole application before you can finally send off your application to UCAS. For this reason, we do ask that you do not leave your applications until the last minute - thank you.

OTHER NEWS

Uniform Expectations from January 2025

If a student arrives into school with a missing uniform item, the expectation is they will be loaned an item for that day. This includes loaning black shoes/trainers, ties, blazers, trousers, skirts and shirts, all of which are now held as available items.

<u>ALL</u> uniform items are now stored centrally in the Student Support area under the management of Mrs Clark. All uniform items loaned are clean and for temporary use.

Procedure for students arriving into school with a missing uniform item:

- 1. Report to the Student Support area to borrow the item. Blazers, ties and shoes/trainers are retrieved at the end of each school day to avoid being misplaced.
- 2. The student can retain the loaned item of trousers, skirt, shirt, jumper for the school day. Loaned items should be washed and returned to school within 5 working days.

Alternatively, a parent/carer can bring the missing item to Reception to replace the loaned item before 11:00am. If this option is preferable, this must be confirmed via email to pclark@latimer.org.uk

A uniform pass will only be issued where a parent/carer has contacted us via email pclark@latimer.org.uk or spoken to us regarding the extenuating circumstance for that day.

Please note: a student refusing to wear borrowed items (with no exceptional reason that we know of), will be expected to sit in the internal isolation room until the issue is resolved.

Where parents/carers are in receipt of Pupil Premium and struggling to fund an item, they should contact Mrs Clark at pclark@latimer.org.uk who can organise a replacement item in most circumstances.
