Free Schools Meals

We want to make sure that we are providing your child with the best education and support we can. Nutritious school food has obvious health benefits and can help students to establish good eating habits for life. Healthy school food can also help to improve a student's readiness to learn. Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals. Please find a letter attached with further information on how you can apply. For all of those who are eligible, the College receives additional funding that can then be used to support your child's education.

Ensuring success through outstanding attendance

We must take this opportunity to remind you that, under DfE rules, head teachers **may not grant** any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Parents and carers may be given a fixed term penalty for taking their child on holiday during term time without consent from the College. These penalties can range from between £60 and £120 and are payable within 28 days. Each parent and carer may be fined for each individual child. Penalties are imposed by Northamptonshire County Council (NCC) and the monies collected do **not** come to the College.

Unauthorised holidays which result in absences of 10 school sessions (the equivalent of 5 days) or more may be referred for fixed term penalties.

The College has a legal responsibility to enforce this and so we will not authorise leave of absence for holidays. Absences will only be granted for exceptional circumstances with approval from the Principal following submission of a Leave of Absence request form, which can be obtained from Student Services.

And why would you want to miss all of this?

We have a fantastic range of learning experiences and opportunities this term:

- Year 10 and Year 12 Exams: For Year 10, exams will run from Wednesday 20 until Thursday 28 June. For Year 12, exams will mainly run from Monday 25 until Thursday 28 June (with some small changes for students who study Geography due to their field trip).
- Sixth Form UCAS Exhibition: on Friday 29 June, Year 12 students will be taken to the University of Bedfordshire, where they will be able to access information regarding higher education, apprenticeships and gap years, amongst other things. They will also have the opportunity to look around a university campus.
- Sixth Form Induction Week: for those Year 11 students who plan to join us in September, attending these sessions from Monday 2 July to Friday 6 July is compulsory.

• Year 12 Work Experience: newly introduced this year, running from Monday 2 July to Friday 6 July, as part of our Raising Aspirations programme, our Year 12 students will undertake a week of work experience designed to support them to develop their employability skills.


