Parent Carer's Voice: Contributing to School Improvement

We are delighted to host the first meeting of the academic year of our Latimer Parents'/Carers' Forum. The meeting will take place on Tuesday 31 October from 6pm until 7pm in Music Room 2 (upstairs in The Masque).

The Parents'/Carers' Forum works closely with the Senior Leadership Team to support College improvement. This is not the same as a PTA, there is no fundraising work involved, only a willingness from parent and carer volunteers who give up their time to engage in dialogue about College improvement. It provides an opportunity for the College to hear the parents'/carers' voice: for them to give feedback, evaluate College systems from a parent and carer perspective and to make suggestions for further improvements.

The Department for Education's published attendance guidance, <u>'Working together to improve</u> <u>school attendance'</u>, stresses the importance of us all working collaboratively to ensure that students attend school regularly. Good attendance has to be a high priority: when students are absent, they develop gaps in their learning, which may be difficult to catch up on.

Tips for a Safe Halloween and Bonfire Night

Northamptonshire Police and the Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service have issued advice on how to ensure everyone experiences a safe Halloween and Bonfire Night.

Candles and flames: Candles can be popular for use in pumpkins and homes at Halloween but, unfortunately, candles also cause many fires and can be a hazard to families and homes. Opt for artificial candles instead.

Fireworks: Firstly, it sounds simple, but read the instructions on fireworks. Never throw fireworks or store them unsafely, such as in a pocket. It is illegal to buy fireworks under the age of 18. Fireworks cannot be set off between 11pm and 7am, except for Bonfire Night, when the cut off is midnight. You must not set off or throw fireworks in the street or other public places.

Bonfires: Before lighting a bonfire, always check the structure is sound and there are no small children or animals hiding inside. Position the bonfire away from sheds, fences and trees. Never use petrol or paraffin to light a fire.

Learning and Progress

Latimer Loves Literacy

Here at Latimer we recognise the importance of our responsibility to ensure that our young people leave the College with good literacy skills to empower them to read their own world and write their own history!

LATIMER LOVES READING!

Our College library, run by Mrs Brooking our qualified librarian, is open before and after school as well as during break and lunch times and we encourage all students to access the diverse range of both fiction and non-fiction texts. Also available are tablets with access to our online learning programmes as well as Satchel:One.

Accelerated Reader: Years 7 and 8

Students in Years 7 and 8 have a fortnightly literacy lesson, during which they access Accelerated Reader, an online programme which allows staff to monitor students' understanding of the books they are reading. After completing a book, students are able to 'quiz' and answer a series of comprehension questions allowing them to track their progress as well as the number of words read. We usually crown our first 'millionaire reader' towards the end of term 2; could this be your child?

Students can access Accelerated Reader from home via the 'Quick Links' tab on the Latimer home page. Their login details are their IT number followed by their date of birth (ddmmyy).

Bedrock Vocabulary: Years 7, 8 and 9

Students in Years 7-9 access Bedrock Learning, an online vocabulary intervention programme with a focus on exposing students to Tier 2 vocabulary.



Years 7 and 8 access this as part of their literacy lesson and it forms part of the extended learning schedule for all Key Stage 3 students, with the expectation that they achieve a minimum of 20 points per week.

Students can access Bedrock from home via the 'Quick Links' tab on the Latimer home page. Their login details are case sensitive.

Each half term, Bedrock run a competition with prizes including £10 Amazon vouchers and Google Chromebooks! All students who achieve the minimum expectation of 20 points per week across the half term will be automatically entered into the draw. Remember: you've got to be in it to win it!

Pembroke College Cambridge Visit

On Friday 6 October twelve of our Year 11 students were invited to Pembroke College, Cambridge for a full day of activities exploring what higher education is and how Cambridge is different to other universities. Students were able to ask current University of Cambridge students about student life before having a tour of the college. In the afternoon, a fifth year medical student presented a thought-provoking seminar on medical ethics followed by a talk on how to improve university applications.
