Learning and Progress

GCSE and A Levels: The Final Countdown (64 school days and counting...)

Years 11 and 13 have now had their mock papers returned and, following the Year 11 SPRE and the forthcoming Year 13 SPRE (Wednesday 23 January), there should be a clear understanding of the priority areas for each student to focus on in this final exam countdown. A few to highlight are:

Exam Support Page: We have set up a webpage dedicated to Year 11 and 13 exam preparation and will continue to populate this with information and exam support strategies over the coming weeks. This includes tools to support students with planning out their revision and a list of the daily revision sessions that will be offered, for which we will also send out regular reminders.

<u>GCSE Examination Schedule:</u> Please be aware that there will be a significant number of GCSE practical exams taking place over the next two terms, prior to the examination season starting in full.

Equipment: If there is one concern that did arise from the mock examination process, it is that many students were not fully equipped for all exams. Listed on the **Exam Support Page** is all of the equipment that we recommend **ALL** students in **ALL** year groups have, along with some tips and suggestions that could help to gain an extra few marks that could be the difference between one grade and the next.

Year 11 Future Destinations Evening: Please do come along with your child on Thursday 31 January to this new event where we hope to raise your awareness of options post-18, to support with decision making at the end of Year 11. Invitation letters have been issued and we would be grateful if you could confirm attendance so that we can make the necessary arrangements.

Easter Revision Programme: As Term 4 starts, we will publish invitations to revision sessions that will be offered during the Easter holiday period. We would ask that you keep this time free, pending the publication of the dates.

- Our Year 7 students have read **19,507,604** words this year so far and passed **587** quizzes
- Our Year 8 students have read **21,304,476** words this year so far and passed **530** quizzes
- Therefore, collectively, they have read **40,812,080** words this year and passed **1,117** quizzes!

Safeguarding Update

Attendance: Final day of term

We were disappointed with the drop in attendance on the final day of term. Whilst we appreciate that the afternoon saw the curriculum disbanded, we did undertake a range of community events which is an important part of our ethos and something that we are proud of. In addition, normal lessons did continue up until lunchtime and those students who did not attend have missed out. We do expect students to attend on the final day of Term 3 and we will send specific reminders to those who were not present on 21 December.

Student Safety: Roadworks at St Botolph's Road / Barton Road Junction

We have had communication from a representative from Redwell Homes, who are carrying out the current 10-week roadworks at this junction, as they are deeply concerned about student safety. It would appear that our students are ignoring the designated safe pathway round the roadworks and that, as some have headphones on and/or are looking their phones whilst passing through this area, they are putting themselves in danger at what is a very busy and congested spot.

If your child does walk this way to College we would urge you to speak to them about not putting themselves at unnecessary risk.
