Students have been issued with their Personal Details' and 'Special Diet/Allergy' documents for you to check. It is essential that you complete and return these to your child's form tutor by Friday 22 September. This ensures we have the most up to date information available about your child to ensure that we are able to monitor their well-being effectively.

In July, 25 current and former students went on the adventure of a lifetime, with a 3-week expedition to explore everything Southern India had to offer. During the visit they trekked through tea plantations, went searching for tigers on safari in Mudumalai National Park and spent some well-earned time at the beach relaxing at the end of the adventure.

The biggest part of the expedition was carrying out a community project. We had two teams, one spent their time in the villages, supporting the locals with long term development projects in the fields and playing games in the schools, whilst the other worked at the ARMDS project, which supports children who have had to drop out of school due to family circumstances and children with disabilities. They helped build a new dining hall and also played games with the children. All the students had opportunities to develop teamwork, leadership skills, resilience, problem-solving, innovation and self-management - skills they will carry with them throughout their lives.

At the end of the 3 weeks, students returned to school totally exhausted but unable to stop talking about the incredible experiences they had. Keep an eye out for details of our next expedition!
