

Our Student Achievement

At The Latimer Arts College, we believe in encouraging students to aspire for the highest possible academic achievement. We believe in the value of examinations as the 'passport' for accessing higher education or training and a wider choice of careers.

GCSE and Level 2 Performance Measures

Schools are currently judged on the following measures:

Student Progress (Progress 8): the average progress made by students in 8 subjects, with Maths and English progress having a double weighting. This is reported as a number which compares the progress made by students at the school, to the national progress made by similar students. A score above 0 means students at the school are making better progress than the national average.

Student Attainment (Attainment 8): the best grades students achieve in 8 subjects. This is reported as a number, which adds the scores of the best 8 grades achieved by each student. This is compared to the score achieved by all students nationally, and takes no account of their starting point.

GCSE and Level 2 Performance 2025

In 2019 Key Stage 2 testing did not take place so there are no progress measures for 2025. In 2024 students at The Latimer Arts College made **above expected progress**, our results put us in the top 30% of schools nationally. Our progress score was **+0.23**. This progress score reflects the same level of **above average** results for Year 11 students as **2017, 2018, 2019**, and **2023** (2020-2022 were not reported due to Covid).

Our initial analysis suggests that progress made in 2025 was in line with these previous years.

In 2024 67% of students achieved 4+ in both English and Maths, with 36% achieving a 5+ in both subjects.

In 2025 69% of students achieved 4+ in both English and Maths, with 39% achieving a 5+ in both subjects.

A Level and BTEC Level 3 Performance

In 2024 the progress of students at Level 3 was +0.1, which means students made above expected progress. Our average points score per student was 34.9 compared to the Local Authority score of 32.2 and the score for all of England of 35.6.

We do not yet have official data for 2025 however our high student achievement continued with A*/A at 18% and A*-B at 37%. In our applied qualifications 60% of BTEC grades were Distinction * or Distinction and 100% were Distinction * to Merit.

We believe students achieve highly due to excellent, expert teaching, good attitudes to learning and being highly motivated, happy students.
