We are pleased to announce a further improvement on the school's 2023 and 2019 examination grades, with nearly half of all grades being A\*-B and 83% of all grades being A\*-C, which is significantly above the national average. We are equally proud to have 100% of students achieving Distinction\* to Merit grades in vocational subjects.


We are also very proud of the achievements of our GCSE students - there were some fantastic results and a large number of students have chosen to continue their studies at Latimer's Sixth Form.

#### BACK TO SCHOOL AND READY TO LEARN

A reminder that our start of the year Information Pack for Parents and Carers, which can be found on the website, contains key 'need to know' information so that your child is well-prepared for the academic year ahead. In addition to this, we publish a Sixth Form Student Guide, also on the website, to support those who have joined us for post-16 studies.

We would also like to highlight the Satchel:one app. satchel:one



This app is a crucial communication tool between the school and home, and in addition to extend learning tasks, you are able to view live updates on your child's behaviour, positive and negative, and information regarding detentions. You can also see your child's attendance on the app.

By using the app, you can stay informed about your child's progress and conduct in school, enabling you to engage in meaningful conversations with your child about their academic journey. Furthermore, this app is not only for parents and carers; students can also download it to take responsibility for their behaviour and track their own progress.

We would also like to remind you of the following money saving support that Latimer can offer:

Financial Support: We can provide financial support for uniform for those students who are eligible for the Pupil Premium Funding. Uniform Swap Shop: We have donated items that are in excellent condition (washed and ironed) waiting for a new home. If you would like to access this uniform, your child can go to Student Services and select the items that they need or you can contact our Student Services Receptionist, Miss Donald, who will be happy to help: gdonald@latimer.org.uk or contact her on 01536 720300. In turn, if you have items that you no longer need, we would be delighted if you could donate them!

Lost Property: You would not believe how much lost property we have in Student Services. Rather than replacing lost items, please ask your child to visit Student Services to check if their lost item is in lost property. If you can put names on items, including ties, this will help us with returning them. We keep lost property for two terms. After this, we will add relevant items to our Uniform Swap Shop and donate remaining items to charity.

#### **Enrichment Activities Consent Form**

In order for students to take part in enrichment activities, including clubs and fixtures taking place outside of the normal school day, we require parents and carers to complete a Consent Form. Without a completed consent form, students will not be permitted to take part. You can scan the QR code to access the consent form - it really is quick and simple to do. This form needs to be filled in each year.

#### Did you know...?

...that just registering your child for Free School Meals means that the school gets extra money?

With this money we could give extra help to students who need it. If you are registered for Free School Meals you could also get help with things like music tuition, school trips or other out of school activities, or there could be help to allow your child to continue into the Sixth Form.

If you want your child to have a free, healthy meal at lunchtime that's great - they will get the free meal (saving you more than £400 a year). Even if you don't want the school meals, as long as you qualify and are registered, the school still gets the extra government funding.

No one will know you have registered and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming. Our cashless catering system ensures no other student knows who is receiving Free School Meals. # SAFEGUARDING, BEHAVIOUR AND ATTENDANCE

I would like to introduce myself as the new Assistant Principal for Safeguarding, Behaviour and Attendance. I am very excited about working at Latimer. I have come from Campion School in Northampton doing a similar role and have already got to know many of our students.

In the following areas, I would like to share with you some of my plans and priorities:

#### **Safeguarding**

- Develop our anti-bullying processes even further and work towards securing the highest accreditation in this area.
- Continue to focus on student voice to ensure our students feel safe as well as ensuring students receive briefings from me on key topics in this area.

#### **Attendance**

- Continued focus on punctuality. I ask that you work with me to ensure your child arrives to school by 8.25 am.
- Intervene with students whose attendance is below 96% and introduce inter-house competitions in this area.

#### **Behaviour**

- Raise our expectations in creating disruption free classrooms.
- Ensure that all students have the right uniform for the day. Students with any missing items including the wrong shoes, will be expected to borrow school items.
- Develop systems for ensuring students complete extended learning and address this when not completed.

# SAFEGUARDING, BEHAVIOUR AND **ATTENDANCE**

#### **Contacting You**

As we start the new academic year, it is vital that we have up to date information about each student. Within the next few weeks, your child will be issued with a 'Personal Details' sheet for you to check and sign. When completing this form, please ensure you provide us with at least 2 relevant and up to date contacts. Can we please ask that those of you who have provided us with details in the past check carefully that these details are still correct. It is important that we have the right details if we need to contact you in an emergency.

#### **Attendance**

As a parent/carer you are legally responsible for making sure your child attends school regularly.

At Latimer we believe that every child is entitled to the same opportunities, including the educational benefits, social and emotional learning and belonging to their House and School.

It is important that you and your child develop a positive attitude to school attendance and punctuality so that they do not miss out on these opportunities. These qualities of reliability are also important in adult life.

Poor attendance disrupts a child's education. This causes a lack of continuity and progression in schoolwork and can establish patterns of behaviour which may lead to long-term truancy. Missing school prevents children from building essential learning blocks of skills knowledge and prevents them from making educational links, leading to poor progression and anxiety.

We will work with parents/carers to identify barriers and seek provision from local partners to ensure the support is in place where necessary. Please see our **Policies** page on the website for full details of our Attendance Policy.

#### **Contacting Us**

Should you need to make urgent contact with your child during the school day, this should be done bν contacting Student Services Reception.

It is not helpful if parents and carers contact their child during the school day via text messaging or calls to a mobile as we will confiscate mobile phones if seen and students will be placed in our daily detention.

In school, we use Unifrog in a variety of ways. Useful links and documents are added as tasks for students to look into. Students from Years 7-11 will be uploading to Unifrog at the end of each term what they have covered in their weekly Future Me tutor time session. Individual careers appointment action plans for students are uploaded to Unifrog. In Sixth Form, Unifrog is used extensively as part of the post-18 application process as well as the work experience programme in Year 12.

#### **QR codes - keeping safe from scams**

Chances are, you've probably scanned a QR code or two in your time – giving you a quick and easy shortcut to a website, a social media profile, or some other online resource. Sadly, scammers have taken to using them to trick the public out of their personal information. In fact, Greater Manchester Police have said there has been a "steep rise" in the use of malicious QR codes as a "new way to defraud people". This comes after the UK's National Anti Fraud Network, Action Fraud, found that over half the people using QR codes struggled to know whether they're legitimate.

While the importance of keeping yourself safe from these scams goes without saying, it can be tricky to know which codes can be trusted ✓ and which should be avoided ←.
