






GCSES - WHAT TO EXPECT

HOMEWORK


- Homework will be set weekly to create flashcards and revise for the recall tests the next week

WHY FLASHCARDS?

- In the exam, you get asked a question, you then have to answer it. With flashcards, you have a question and then you have to answer it
- Revise any way you like, if you're doing revision that's awesome, but please do flashcards as well
 - You could do revision by mindmapping a topic then test what you have just done by going through the flashcards on that topic
 - Run through some flashcards then complete a practice exam question on the topics you have covered
- They can be used really effectively...

USING FLASHCARDS?

- Yes and no piles
- If you get the answer right = yes pile, if you don't = no pile
- Then focus on the no pile only, until they are all in the yes pile
- Restart process
- Means you aren't going through everything, every time



BOOKLETS

- We have booklets for students to complete the idea being they will have a set of revision guides they have made across the two years to use
