Educational Provision

Home Learning: Term 5

There will be no home learning set over the Easter period, but staff are busy planning for Term 5. All details will be published in our next newsletter on Friday 17 April.

Initially, lessons will be set for the first two weeks. We are going to slim down the KS3 provision (Years 7 and 8) to Core and EBacc subjects (English, Maths, Science, History, Geography and French). We will supplement this with some personal development type activities.

We also plan to introduce some home-learning for our Year 11 students who may be planning to join our Sixth Form. This will be in the form of 'Foundation Studies' that will help to bridge the gap between GCSE and A Level learning in each subject.

We are currently considering longer term plans for home learning from Monday 4 May and these will be shared with you in due course.

Term 5 Childcare Provision for Key Workers

We will not be running a childcare provision over Easter.

We will open up the provision at the start of Term 5 for the children of key workers and our vulnerable students, unless the government guidance changes or there is not a need for it.

Should you need to access this provision please email <u>mail@latimer.org.uk</u> and we will notify you by email if a place has been offered.

Please can we re-iterate *that whilst we are keen to support our key workers, the government guidance is that students should stay at home if they are able to as this is the safest place to be.*

Not only are we offering support to our key workers by providing Childcare Provision, but we have also donated over 200 pairs of goggles to the hospital this week. We hope that this goes a small way to helping to save lives over the coming weeks.

Dr Frost maths: for higher tier KS4 students and all A Level Maths / Further Maths students www.drfrostmaths.com



Kerboodle: This gives students electronic access to the Maths GCSE textbooks at both foundation and higher tiers. <u>https://www.kerboodle.com/users/login</u> Username: first initial followed by surname. Password is the same thing (students can change at first login). The institution code is abj5. This is being used significantly when the Maths team are setting work during the closure for years 9 and 10 in particular.

Safeguarding and Well-Being

Children's guide to Coronavirus



There have been big changes in our lives recently and The Children's Commissioner for England has put together <u>a guide</u> that might be useful to support our younger students in explaining Coronavirus and how to stay safe and active.

Key Information

Free School Meal Voucher Scheme

The Government has published details of its voucher scheme so that money can be provided for those students who are eligible for Free School Meals. A £15 weekly voucher per child will be issued from the start of Term 5. We are currently liaising with the DfE and will contact families accordingly as soon as possible with more information.

In the meantime, unless you receive confirmation from the College, via our usual communication system, please **do not** respond to messages that you may get about Free School Meals. Sadly, there are fraudsters out there!

Year 11 and 13 Exams Results

As soon as we receive any further information or guidance about the process for the issuing of exam results, we will update you immediately. Please see the most recent <u>Government Guidance on cancellation of GCSEs, AS</u> and A levels in 2020 (20th March). Please can we remind parents, carers and students <u>**not**</u> to contact staff directly. To ensure the integrity of the system we will not be responding to individual queries.

Please note that as we are unclear as to how grades will be awarded for BTEC qualifications, in the short term, we will not be publishing unit marks for the BTEC examinations that have been taken recently.

Year 13 UCAS Update

Last week we informed you that UCAS were extending May's UCAS Undergraduate decision and reply deadlines. UCAS have now confirmed the new deadline dates:

Original date	UCAS Undergraduate deadline	New date
5 May 2020	The deadline for applicants to reply if they received decisions from all their choices by 31 March 2020.	19 May 2020
6 May 2020	The deadline for universities and colleges to make decisions and reply to applications received by 15 January 2020.	20 May 2020

These dates have been updated in Track, and UCAS have emailed applicants to let them know if their deadlines have changed. UCAS hopes that this gives students and their chosen universities and colleges the extra time they need to fully consider any decisions and offers, and ensures fairness in admissions is maintained.

Cancelled Enrichment Activities: Refund Process

Please note, that as of the time of publication, the Year 10 Geography Fieldtrip to Amersham has not yet been cancelled.
