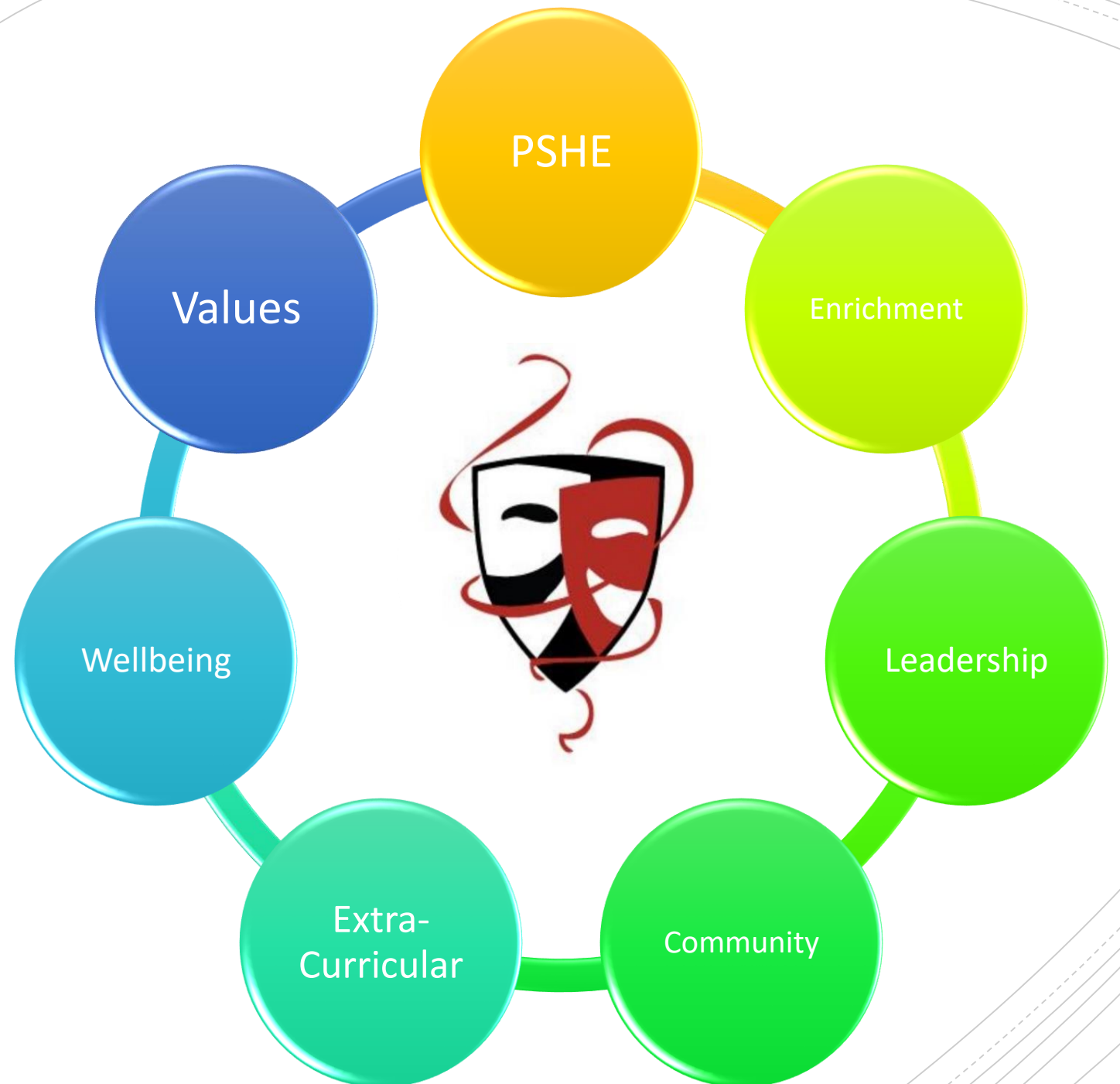

# Pastoral Support



- Form Tutor – First point of contact between home and school
- Form Tutor email as personal contact
- Pastoral care, academic mentoring, guidance and support
- Form groups are made up of one year group
- There will be 8 Year 7 Forms
- 2 Forms per Year group will belong to one of our 4 Houses
- There will be lots of opportunities to earn house points through competition and activities

## PSHE



- Our PSHE/ RSE sessions meet all new RSE statutory content.
- Our students learn age appropriate content through 6 core themes
  1. Rights, Responsibilities and British Values
  2. Celebrating Diversity and Equality
  3. Relationship and Sex Education
  4. Staying Safe, Online & Offline
  5. Health and Wellbeing
  6. Life Beyond School
- Each year builds on previous learning

## LORIC Skills



- In one Personal Development session each week our students will learn and plan to demonstrate 5 key life and employability skills each term.
- These five skills are:
  1. **Leadership**
  2. **Organisation**
  3. **Resilience**
  4. **Initiative**
  5. **Communication**
- Students learn the importance of each attribute and with the help of their tutors, plan an activity that helps them demonstrate these skills practically
- Students receive a certificate on completion of the attribute and recognition through our assemblies



## Votes for Schools



- Our final Personal Development session is based around topical issues and encourages our students to voice and share their opinions on contentious issues
- The Votes for Schools programme contains a series of assemblies and tutor sessions that engage our students and promote them to be
  1. Be informed
  2. Be Curious
  3. Be Heard
- At the end of each topic students can vote and the results are published in the next weeks resource. Giving our students feedback on national and local results

- Students should speak to teaching staff if not sure about any tasks before the due date
- Prioritise and complete homework by date or time required to complete
