Covid-19 Updates

Changes to the Requirements for a PCR Test

Please can we remind you that from 11 January, people who receive positive lateral flow device (LFD) test results for coronavirus (COVID-19) will be required to self-isolate immediately and will not be required to take a confirmatory PCR test.

This is a temporary measure that the government have introduced while COVID-19 rates remain high across the UK. Whilst levels of COVID-19 are high, the vast majority of people with positive LFD results can be confident that they have COVID-19. *Please note that this is for asymptomatic cases only.*

Anyone who develops 1 of the 3 main COVID-19 symptoms should stay at home and self-isolate and take a PCR test. They must self-isolate if they get a positive test result, even if they have had a recent negative lateral flow test – these rules have not changed. However, the government has announced that from 17 January the isolation period will be reduced from 7 days to 5 full days. Anyone who has two negative tests (day 5 and day 6) can leave isolation from the start of day 6.

Twice Weekly LFD Testing

We strongly urge you to ensure that your child is testing twice per week using the LFD test kits provided by the College so that we can break the chain of community transmission, support with reducing infection rates and protect the education of our students.

Please can we remind you of the importance of reporting all tests results (positive, negative and void) to NHS Test and Trace.

Wearing of Face Masks

As you are aware, it is currently recommended that face masks are worn in schools, including in classrooms and we thank you for your support with this. The vast majority of our students are wearing a mask and we do hope that this will play a part in reducing infection rates.

This is a temporary measure introduced by the Government and will be reviewed on Wednesday 26 January. We will update you if there are any changes as soon as we are aware of them.

Learning and Progress

Ace Your Exams: Year 11 and 13 Post-Mock Actions

Students have now received their mock exam results. The key message following this is that no matter what a student achieved, their future grades are not yet set in stone and are still very much in their own hands. To support students in these year groups:

- We are arranging further study skills sessions
- We will be planning more mock assessments to support them to be fully prepared for the summer exams
- We are also undertaking 1:1 meetings with Year 11s to discuss the next stages of their education
- Year 13 are being supported with their UCAS and Apprenticeship applications
- We are offering students careers interviews

As the Government have announced again that they expect summer exams to go ahead as normal, some amendments to exam content are being made. We have been told to expect further information by Monday 7 February. We will update you on this when we receive it.

In addition to this, Year 11 and Year 13 SPREs are both upcoming, with Year 11 SPRE on Wednesday 19 January and Sixth Form on Wednesday 26 January. We urge all parents and carers to make appointments as this evening will provide vital information on both your child's current progress and also how you can help them go on to achieve their very best.

Parents and carers will receive separate information about the arrangement for the SPREs, which will be held virtually.
