Year 7 and 8 Students: What Book is in Your Bag?

Books can really enrich lives, allowing us to experience the pleasure of reading and reap the benefits that reading for pleasure has, not only on educational success but in enhancing vocabulary, developing empathy and so much more!

'Drop Everything and Read' (DEAR) provides an opportunity for Year 7 and Year 8 students (and their teachers!) to read for pleasure for 15 minutes each day. In addition to this, they will access our 'Accelerated Reader' (AR) programme which helps manage and monitor independent reading. During AR lessons, students can read a fiction book of their choice during this time, which may be one brought in from home or borrowed from our College Learning Resource Centre as 'Accelerated Reader' lessons get underway.

Please ensure that your child has a reading book in their bag every day to ensure they can take part in DEAR. They never know when they might be asked: "What book is in your bag?"

UCAS Parent and Carer Guide

Year 13 students are currently preparing university applications, with the first application deadline of 15 October approaching for all students considering Oxbridge or medical courses. We encourage **all** students to complete applications and then, for those Sixth Form students who wish to apply to university, to have their applications sent by the end of November so that they have the best chance of being offered a place, with the final deadline being 26 January 2023.

Other News and Information

Did you know that just registering your child for Free School Meals means that the College gets extra money?

With this money we could give extra help to students who need it. If you are registered for Free School Meals you could also get help with things like music tuition, school trips or other out of school activities, or there could be help to allow your child to continue into the Sixth Form.

If you want your child to have a free, healthy meal at lunchtime, that's great – they will get the free meal (saving you more than £400 a year). Even if you don't want the school meals, as long as you qualify and are registered, the College still gets the extra government funding.

No one will know you have registered and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming. Our cashless catering system ensures no other student knows who is receiving Free School Meals. Please click <u>Free School Meals</u> to access the online application form.

Accessing the 16 to 19 Bursary Fund for Sixth Form Students

If you have a child in our Sixth Form, you may be eligible to apply to access the 16 to 19 Bursary Fund. This fund provides financial support to help students overcome specific financial barriers to participation, so they can remain in education and support with costs such as transport, books, clothing and equipment. If, as a household, you earn less than £30,000 then you may be eligible for additional funding, so if you have not already been directed to this, you can find further details on our website of eligibility and how to apply for a bursary.
