Dear All

Over the last few incredibly difficult weeks, we have been uplifted by the news and photographs that you have shared with us and with the support and understanding that you have shown. There has been a recognition that teachers and school staff are facing similar challenges to everyone else as we try to go about our core business of educating our students with severe restrictions and vague, slow and sometimes contradictory guidance, from the Government.

We really do appreciate this support and it helps to drive us on; to motivate us to battle through the tough times; and to remain strong and resolute in our determination to do the best for our students.

However, as we start this week's newsletter, this is not how we are feeling!

We have to express our intense sadness and disappointment that a small number of parents and carers have taken to social media to negatively compare our provision to other schools in the area!

Please do not. Firstly, you are not modelling the best behaviours for your children and secondly, your judgement is not rooted in a deep understanding of the challenges that we face. If you want to know more, you only have to contact us and we will happily talk this through with you.

We cannot stress enough that each school has its own unique circumstances to consider in offering the correct and safe provision for its students. For example, some schools do not allow their students as much choice in their GCSE subjects options as we do at Latimer, making it easier for them to create more 'safe bubbles' for students to attend. Others have newer buildings, with larger classrooms, bigger communal spaces and wider corridors, meaning they can fit more students in safely at one time. All schools have a different staffing profile and some may have greater numbers of staff available to provide onsite support.

We constantly speak to the schools in the surrounding area to share ideas and learn from each other, so that we can all do our very best for all the children in this community in the current crisis. We can each do some things that the others cannot, but we are all doing our very best.

And please do not think that we are doing any less than our very best. I promised that we would not become complacent and we are not. I promised that we would work flat out to find better ways of doing things and we are. I promise that all we want is all of our students back safe and sound and experiencing the high quality learning experience that this College is proven to deliver.

We understand your frustrations about the current situation, many of us are parents too, but what we, and your children need at the moment, is your continuing support as we work unrelentingly through these difficult, trying and unique times.

Educational Provision

Term 6 Home Learning: Week Commencing 15 June

Years 7 and 8: Students will be issued with their next set of project activities. To supplement the booklets, students can also access lessons from the <u>National Academy</u>.

Staff love receiving the pictures and photos of the various projects that are being created; please continue to send them in as your child works through the projects which are set.

Year 9: Thank you for the positive emails we have received following the changes we have made, based on your feedback, to the Year 9 provision. A reminder that work will be set through Show My Homework and students should be following the revised timetable published and sent to them. They will continue to receive the home learning booklet as additional work for them to do if they wish to.

Personal Development: Years 7, 8 and 9 should also continue with their 'Motivate Me' scheme. This is a series of sessions to inspire our students to get motivated about their studies, life and their future opportunities. There are six sessions for them to take part in. In addition to this, the Achievement Team will be 'delivering' two remote assemblies over the coming weeks. More details to follow on this.

Year 10: Students will continue to have lessons set on SMHW and should be accessing new material now. Their face to face sessions will support this remote learning, in accordance with the Government guidance.

Year 11: These students should work through their Foundation Learning Booklet, if they are progressing to Level 3 studies.

Year 12: Students will continue to have lessons set on SMHW and should be accessing new material now. Their face to face sessions on Microsoft Teams will support this remote learning, in accordance with the Government guidance.

Year 11 Leavers' Celebrations

Today would have seen the final GCSE exam, with the end of A Levels following next week. We share the disappointment that Year 11 students will be feeling over the next week as their cancelled Prom date approaches. Whilst we can make no promises, we will continue to look at whether there will be an opportunity in the future for our students to celebrate their time at Latimer and we will update you accordingly over time.

However, we do have a few leavers ideas that we are working on and we very much look forward to sharing more on this with you in the next couple of weeks.

Year 12 Face to Face Sessions

Year 12 will start their online Teams sessions on Monday 22 June. To support this, we have included a Year 12 **Microsoft Teams User Protocol** and the **Year 12 Face to Face Teams Timetable** that will be followed. We ask that you encourage your child to access all of their sessions.

In addition to this, Year 12 students who have registered an interest in attending an onsite day will be sent details next week of this session, which will take place on Tuesday 30 June. We may be able to offer a further session before the end of the academic year.
