# Lunchtime Reorganisation: Bringing Back a Single Lunchtime

We are delighted to be able to inform you that from the start of Term 6, we will be reinstating our single, 45-minute lunchtime session. This means that year groups will no longer be divided across two lunchtime sessions. This will enable us to reintroduce some of our lunchtime enrichment activities, such as PE and Performing Arts clubs and revision and study sessions for our students, during the remainder of this academic year and into the forthcoming year.

# Please note: This change does not affect the start or end time of the College day.

# Learning and Progress

## Year 11 and 13 Examinations: We are Green for Go!

Unbelievably, we are now in the exam period, with both year groups having already started exams. We knew that the time would fly and so it has. We would like to remind parents and carers that advice, including revision templates and information about useful apps, can be found on our <u>website</u>.

We understand that this can be a stressful time and so we are here to help if you need us. Further advice and guidance can also be found at <u>Young Minds.</u>

Year 13: Students are expected to attend normal lessons in a subject until their exams have been completed. Should they have an afternoon exam, they are permitted to study at home for that morning.

**Year 11:** Students have been issued with their Alternative Timetable, with details of where they should be and when. We would ask that all parents and carers look at this schedule. Normal lessons will continue for as long as is practically possible, and then students move to a blend of examinations, compulsory revision sessions and home study. The <u>Alternative Timetable</u> can be accessed on our website.

# Exam Preparation: Examination Room Requirements

Please help us to help your child be successful throughout this exam season by:

- Ensuring that they attend all of the revision sessions: these are compulsory!
- Making sure they arrive for the right exams at the right time. Text reminders about exams will be sent to parents and carers the day before. Briefing sessions will run for GCSE exams 30 minutes before the start times and we would expect all students to attend these.
- Making sure they are dressed in full College uniform / Sixth Form dress code.
- Making sure that they bring water to drink in a clear plastic bottle. Historically we have provided water for students but, as we are endeavouring to reduce the use of single use plastics, we will not be in a position to do this, this year. However, we can provide a refilling service outside of the Restaurant and in the Sports Hall on a daily basis.
- Making sure they have all the correct equipment. <u>A plea to please make sure that your child has a</u> <u>calculator for the relevant exams and a compass and protractor for Maths exams! They are putting</u> <u>themselves at a disadvantage should they not have this equipment.</u>

<u>Please remember that students are not allowed any potential technological or web enabled devices,</u> <u>such as mobile phones or smart watches in any examination venues</u>. We request that students leave these at home on exam days along with their mobile phones. If they need to bring them in to College, they must be turned off/removed before the exam, and placed in their bag. Any breaches of this will be reported to the relevant exam board and it is inevitable that disqualification will be a consequence.

### Ace Your Exams: A Trial Run for Years 10 and 12

We have written to parents and carers of students in Years 10 and 12 about the plan for their first mock exam season. We are now less than a year away from this cohort of students sitting their external exams and these mock exams provide vital preparation. We ask that parents and carers ensure that they have read the information regarding the arrangements for these and that in preparation for these exams that you encourage your child to access revision guides and <u>exam support material</u> that the College has provided.

## Helping us to help you: Join our Parent and Carer Forum

We are delighted to announce that we are bringing back our Latimer Parents/Carers' Forum, after a two-year gap due to the pandemic. The meeting will take place on Wednesday 8 June at 6pm til 7pm in Music Room 2 (upstairs in The Masque).

The Parents/Carers' Forum works closely with the Senior Leadership Team to support College improvement. This is not the same as a PTA, there is no fundraising work involved, only a willingness from parent and carer volunteers who give up their time to engage in dialogue about College improvement. It provides an opportunity for the College to hear the parent/carers' voice: for them to give feedback, evaluate College systems from a parent and carer perspective and to make suggestions for further improvements.
