## High Standards of Uniform and Equipment: Thank You for a Team Effort!

We would like to say a huge thank you to parents and carers for their support with ensuring that students started Term 5 'Ready to Learn'. It really does make a difference when students meet our expectations as a matter of course.

We appreciate that, after a significant period of Remote Learning, it can be a challenge to get back into previously established routines, but our students have adapted very quickly – and parents and carers have really helped with this.

Despite essential shops not being open, we are grateful for all that you have done to ensure that your child is in the correct uniform, with the correct footwear.

We also appreciate your reinforcement of our policy in relation to jewellery, make-up and nails. We have had to give very few reminders about this.

And we are getting there with mobile phones. We know that it has been difficult for students who have been used to a lot of 'screen time' over the last few months to part with their phones. However, after reinforcement from home and a concerted effort from staff to remind and check, the majority of our students are now routinely placing their phones in their bags as they enter the College site in the morning.

The key now is to sustain this! As a reminder, phones not in bags will now be confiscated, as will any non-uniform items and students may be placed in an after school detention. Anything that you can do to remind your child about this so that we can avoid this would be welcomed.

We would like to ask for your support now with PE kit. Students should be in the College's PE kit as set out below:

- Black and white shorts or black and scarlet skort with school badge
- PE shirt with school badge
- Red football socks for football/rugby and optional trainer socks for other sports

If, for any reason, your child is unable to bring their PE kit, we do need communication from parents and carers about this, either through email to the class teacher or via a note. If there are exceptional circumstances, students can bring an alternative kit for that day but any student who is routinely not in our PE 'uniform' and who does not bring suitable kit may be issued with an after school detention.

# **COVID-19 Lateral Flow Device (LFD) Testing Programme**

### Reducing Community Transmission: Another Team Effort Required!

We know that we all welcome the easing of restrictions that have recently been introduced and the slight increase in freedoms that we now all have. However, we must urge all parents and carers to ensure that they and their family all stick to the current rules. Our incidents of COVID-19 as a school have been low and we must do all that we can together to prevent community transmission – we do not want to have to move to Remote Learning again, as a school or as a nation!

### LFD Home Testing Programme

In line with government guidance, the College will continue to be provided with LFD Test Kits to issue to students who are participating in the twice weekly testing programme. We will distribute these periodically for the remainder of the academic year, unless the guidance changes.

We have to remind you that the home testing kits that have been provided by the government are for twice weekly asymptomatic testing only.

If your child has been identified as a close contact, whilst you and your child may understandably be worried, further testing should only occur if they develop COVID-19 symptoms (including a high temperature; a new, continuous cough; or a loss or change to their sense of smell or taste). If this is the case a PCR test should be booked by calling 119 or visiting <u>https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</u>: the LFD tests should NOT be used.

In addition to this, whilst we do understand the possible frustrations that parents and carers may have, we do need to confirm that the government guidance is that any close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 must self-isolate, even if they continue to test negative themselves.

### **Test and Trace Support Payment for Parents and Carers**

Parents and carers of children who have been advised to self-isolate by their education setting or by NHS Test and Trace are now able to apply for a <u>Test and Trace Support Payment</u> or discretionary payment of £500, if they meet the eligibility criteria. This is to ensure that eligible parents receive financial support if they are unable to attend work due to childcare responsibilities.

### Awarding Qualifications in Summer 2021 Information

Year 11 and 13 students and their parents and carers have been issued with our booklet that outlines the processes that the College will be following in the awarding of examination grades for 2021.

### Year 11 and 13 Leaving Date

The 'official' leaving date for Year 11 students is Friday 25 June. The DfE have indicated that schools should make provision for Year 11 students from the date of their final assessment until this official leaving date. This might not mean full-time provision and could include visits to education providers, independent study or remote education combined with attendance in person.

Year 11 students are due to complete their assessments by Friday 28 May. Therefore, the College is currently considering what programme it would be suitable to offer our Year 11 students up to their official leaving date. More details of this will follow shortly. We can confirm that an Induction Programme will be offered to those students who have indicated that they wish to join our Sixth Form during this time.

Year 13 students will finish once they have completed their final assessment.

YoungMinds know that finding the right support is important, especially if a student needs someone to talk to immediately. They aim to connect every texter to a trained volunteer promptly to provide crisis help. They will listen to the young person and help them to think more clearly, enabling them to know that they can take the next step to feeling better.

It is free and confidential to text their service from the major mobile networks.

Our students continue to impress with their commitment to reading through our Accelerated Reader Programme.




In total Year 7 students have read 67,313,109 words this year so far and Year 8 47,853,744
