## Exam countdown continues!

As we approach half term, Year 11 and 13 students should be looking forward to a mixture of time to relax and also time to study. The exam season countdown continues (45 school days!). We know that the last few years have been hard for students, which is why it is important that they start planning now and use the remaining few weeks wisely in the build up to the Summer Examination season.

When Year 11 return they will begin a second round of core mocks, focussing on English, Maths, Science and History or Geography. They need to prepare for this experience so that it is a useful exercise for them.

Year 11 have received a 'Topics for Revision' booklet which outlines all of the key areas they will need to know for exams. There is a lot, which is why preparing and planning is key and needs to start now! They have been advised to use this booklet in conjunction with the planning template that was shared with them by email a few weeks ago. We encourage parents and carers to speak to their children about both of these. Students have the chance of a lifetime ahead of them and we want them to grab it!

To support them further, we will also be offering an **Easter Revision Programme**. We would ask that you keep this time free, pending the publication of the dates.

Completing homework helps to develop strong study habits and independent learning skills. Research shows that homework also supports with broadening knowledge and developing problem-solving skills.

'Aspire' is our homework support service which all students are welcome to attend. It runs from 3pm to 4pm in the Learning Resource Centre (LRC) on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Staff are on hand to support with homework, students can access a wide range of resources (including IT) and refreshments are provided.

Since September, the *Latimer Shakespeare Company* have been building upon their performance technique and learning how to become a company of actors. This term, they are auditioning for, rehearsing and staging an abridged production of *Romeo and Juliet* in their enrichment time, with a view to entering the *Shakespeare Schools' Festival* competition in November.

The **Shakespeare Schools' Festival** is a youth drama festival, whereby schools prepare a 30-minute abridged version of a Shakespeare play and visit a professional theatre to perform it, alongside many other schools. The festival is connected with the charity **Shakespeare Schools' Foundation**, which aims to 'engage children through an active way of learning' and '[boost] articulacy and confidence'. All students study a Shakespeare text as part of their English Literature GCSE, therefore this experience will be invaluable to all students who participate.

# **Other News**

## Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) in PE Lessons

In line with the Safe Practice in Physical Education, School Sport and Physical Activity (PESSPA) guidance, we **strongly advise** that the following Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is worn by students when undertaking the following sports in their PE lessons in Term 4, as semi-competitive matches, and therefore contact, may take place:

Year 9 and 10 Boys: Futsal - shinpads Year 7 and 8 Girls: Rugby - mouthguards Years 9, 10 and 11 Girls: Hockey and Rugby - shinpads and mouthguards for hockey and mouthguards for rugby

These girls' PE activities will take place on the 4G pitch and the field so boots are also recommended, as well as outdoor PE kit to keep warm.

# Please note that many students undertake informal sporting activities at break and lunchtime, such as football. The strong advice above applies at these times as well.

In line with this guidance, should you wish your child to wear PPE, it is **parental responsibility** to provide it. Whilst we may have a small supply of spare PPE for any given sport, we are not in a position to guarantee its availability each lesson.

We would recommend that parents and carers ensure that any PPE that is purchased meets the British Standards Institute (BSI) and European (EN) standards.

To support parents and carers with information about when PPE may be needed, we will publish termly information on our <u>website</u>. If there is to be a change of activity during a term and PPE be required, we will send a text message to notify parents and carers of this change.

## Marking of a Moment: Year 11 and 13 Leavers Photos

Tuesday 21 February will see our annual leavers photographs being taken. Students will be offered the opportunity to be part of the whole year group picture and to have an individual leavers photograph taken.
