Year 11 and 13 Ace Your Exams

As we look forward to 2023, students in Year 11 will be entering their exam year! Ofqual have recently confirmed that other than providing a formulae sheet in the exams for GCSE mathematics and a revised equation sheet in the exams for GCSE physics and combined science exams, there will be no other amendments for students this year.



Further to the recent mock exams, students in Year 11 will receive their results in a mock result session on Friday 6 January 2023. Reports will then be sent out ready to support the Year 11 SPRE on Wednesday 11 January. Details on how to sign up for the virtual appointments will be sent to parents and carers shortly.

Year 13 students will receive their results in each subject from their class teachers. There will be an opportunity to discuss their progress and priority areas for improvement at the forthcoming Sixth Form SPRE on Tuesday 24 January.


Enriching the Educational Experience and Celebrating Success
