We know they will continue to demonstrate the Latimer core values in all that they do in the future, as they are not just values for school but for life.



Sixth Form Centre





On Thursday 20 June seven students from Years 8 and 9 were lucky enough to visit Bishop Stopford School as part of the Latimer Shadowing Group taking part in this year's Yoto Carnegie Awards, demonstrating our values of excellence, respect and teamwork in abundance! Our dedicated students have read the eight books that were shortlisted for the award of 'YOTO Carnegie Medal for Writing' and have taken part in discussions and submitted reviews as part of the Shadowing Group process.



During their visit to Bishop Stopford School, alongside other secondary schools from Kettering and Wellingborough, they contributed their reviews and thoughts to discussions before voting for the 'Shadowers Choice Award'. All local schools taking part voted 'The Boy Lost in the Maze' by Joseph Coelho as their winner. Taking into account votes from the multiple shadow groups across the country, the YOTO Carnegie Award for Writing was awarded to 'Crossing the Line' by Tia Fisher, which is available in our Latimer Library.

Review of 'Steady for This' by Nathanael Lessore written by Samuel Wright, Year 9:

The variety of layers in this book and the actual content itself really took me off guard - I didn't expect to have enjoyed it as much as I did! Throughout the entirety of the story, even the chapter names are full of jokes that play on words extremely effectively, and even the lyricism in the rapping aspect of the book is quite surprising with its complexity. From the main character's perspective of not entirely understanding words and their meaning, with a lot of misinterpretations and not much academic knowledge, it emphasises other talents that are less appreciated by others that he excels in. Throughout the book, stereotypes are constantly being rewritten by providing a sense of insight into the character's thoughts that would usually be seen differently by others societally. This was a great read - the type of book I would definitely come back to from time to time, just to see the interesting smaller aspects that I'd missed last time I read it. Highly recommend for any level of reader.
