Ace Your Exams: A Trial Run for Years 10 and 12

As we head into the final few weeks of the public examinations for Years 11 and 13, a reminder that students in Years 10 and 12 are about to undertake their first mock exam season. We are now less than a year away from this cohort of students sitting their external exams and these mock exams provide vital preparation. We ask that parents and carers ensure that they have read the information regarding the arrangements for these and that in preparation for these exams, you encourage your child to access revision guides and the exam support material that the College has provided.

New Parents' Guides to University

As a parent, guardian, or someone with caring responsibilities, you are likely to be one of the most important and trusted sources of information and advice to your child when applying for Higher Education. With that in mind, UCAS have produced a <u>guide</u> that is designed to give you the tools to guide and support a young person applying to study at university or college in 2023 through their decision-making and the UCAS application process.

Safeguarding and Well-Being

Ensuring success through outstanding attendance

We must take this opportunity to remind parents and carers that, under DfE rules, head teachers **may not grant** any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Parents and carers may be given a fixed term penalty for taking their child on holiday during term time without consent from the College. These penalties can range from between £60 and £120 and are payable within 28 days. Each parent and carer may be fined for each individual child. Penalties are imposed by North Northamptonshire Council (NNC) and the monies collected do **not** come to the College.

Unauthorised holidays which result in absences of 10 school sessions (the equivalent of 5 days) or more may be referred for fixed term penalties.

There are many benefits of learning a musical instrument including stimulating the brain and improving memory, stress relief, boosting confidence, improving patience and developing creativity and social skills.

Therefore, we are delighted to be able to offer the opportunity for students to book music instrumental lessons with NMPAT (Northamptonshire Music and Performing Arts Trust) for the next academic year. We have visiting teachers come to the College every week to teach woodwind (flute, oboe, clarinet, saxophone and bassoon), brass (trumpet, tenor horn, French horn, baritone/euphonium, trombone and tuba), strings (violin, viola, cello and double bass), piano and keyboard, drums and guitar (acoustic, electric or bass).

Catering Provision: Summer Menus

Our daily food service is provided by abm Catering Solutions and is served in our Restaurant. Students can purchase breakfast from 8.00am-8.25am and then there is a hot and cold snack service at break and a hot and cold meal service at lunchtime.

Menus offered by abm Catering Solutions are changed regularly. The current menus, which include a meal deal for £2.40, can be accessed on our website.

We urge all parents and carers who are eligible for free school meals to register with Northants County Council. You can check your eligibility and access the online application form here. Our cashless catering system ensures free school meal students remain anonymous to other students. All students who are entitled to free school meals can access the meal deal at no extra cost or are able to choose alternative food up to the value of £2.35 per day.
