A reminder that Year 11 and 12 students can access the National Citizen Service (NCS) away-from-home experiences to help them to **Live It**, **Boss It**, or **Change It** over five-days and four-nights.

What are the benefits of NCS away from home experiences?

- It is only £95 for the entire experience, including accommodation, transport and food (bursaries for Pupil Premium students are available).
- NCS enhances CVs and college applications and is recognised by UCAS. This will benefit personal statements.
- NCS improves confidence and offers skills essential for starting work.
- NCS allows students a chance to stay away from home and develop independence.
