Breaking News: Latimer Hat–Trick in National PiXL Times Table Competitions!



With 3 days to go, as it stands, we are currently in first place in overall points earned in the main PiXL Times table competition and two supplementary games: Bounce and Survival!

Our students have been amazing: showing passionate determination to be the best! And, given our numeracy focus, here are some numbers for you:

- Over 500,000 times tables questions have been answered so far, with over 160,000 in the past 3 weeks alone!
- There have been 250 prize draw tickets already earned, with each ticket being earned by completing 240 questions from each times tables set at over 90% accuracy.
- Castle House has just edged into first place today, but the top form is Botolph 8.
- Ethan Armour (Y7) has completed all 144 times tables and is the first student so far to get the bonus 15 tickets into the draw! He has given up a huge amount of time to this, spending time before school and in breaks to up his score.
- Evie Keech (Y9) has answered over 16,000 questions this year!
- Mia Wood (Y7) has answered over 6000 this term alone!

Students need to keep up their fantastic efforts over the weekend – the competition closes Monday 2 July!

We are delighted by the commitment students in all years are showing towards improving their numeracy and maths skills. The buzz and positivity has been a joy to experience. We hope that you are all proud of your children who are having such fun – and learning along the way!





Did you know that analysis shows that in the new GCSEs the word count has increased significantly!

This means that in a test paper of 105 minutes, with a consistent reading rate of 90 words per minute, 47% of the allocated time could be spent just decoding the text within the paper!

This is why promoting the value of strong literacy skills is so important to us at the College – and reading really is a fun thing to do! It is an action packed time for literacy this term with a range of fantastic activities taking place: all designed to foster a love of reading.

Latimer Book Week Monday 2 July – Friday 6 July 2018: Manga artist Anna Fitzpatrick will be visiting the College on Tuesday 3 July 2018 to deliver workshops throughout the day. Colourful and expressive, using both digital and traditional media, such as pen, ink, watercolours and paint, Anna's work really captures the imagination.

All week there will be a book swap operating throughout the day! Students can bring any books that they have finished reading and no longer want to keep to the LRC and swap with others.

During the week there will be various games and activities occurring in the Learning Resource Centre including Boggle and Scrabble and book related word searches and quizzes.

Carnegie Award 2018: We were delighted to welcome students from Bishop Stopford School, Kettering Buccleuch Academy and Montsaye Academy who all congregated at Latimer to discuss the shortlist for the Carnegie award. Students had read the 8 books on the shortlist and voted for which books they thought were the best.

The winner was then officially announced as *Where the World Ends* by Geraldine McCaughrean, The Amnesty Honour went to *The Hate U Give* by Angie Thomas and the Kate Greenaway (the award for illustration) winner for 2018 was *Town is by the Sea* by Sydney Smith!



Burton Library has so much to offer!

Every Thursday between 3.30pm and 4.45pm a study/homework club, with an experienced teacher, is provided and this service is also offered every other Saturday from 10.30am-12.30pm.

Parent/Carer 'have a go at English' and 'have a go at Maths' workshops are also on offer aimed at adults struggling to support their children. Finally, on Sundays from 11.30am-2.30pm, there is a role playing game group that is open to all aged 14+. There is a small charge of £2.50 each week. Primarily, young people play Dungeons and Dragons but they also play a range of other RPG games such as White Wolf's: Changelings, Vampire and Werewolf, Aliens and Star Wars.
