'Moving Up': Year 7 September 2019

We look forward to welcoming our new Year 7 students (and our new staff!) on their moving up day on Monday 8 July. It will be fun-filled and action-packed – just a typical day in the busy life of a Latimer Learner!

Assessing and Reporting Progress from Year 9

At The Latimer Arts College, students start their GCSEs from September of Year 9 and are graded at 9-1, instead of A*-G. The table below gives an outline of how these “new” grades equate to the old style GCSE grades.

The old and new GCSE grading scales do not directly compare but there are three points where they align, as the diagram shows:

- The bottom of grade 7 is aligned with the bottom of grade A;
- The bottom of grade 4 is aligned with the bottom of grade C;
- The bottom of grade 1 is aligned with the bottom of grade G.

The Department for Education recognises grade 4 and above as a ‘standard pass’ and a grade 5 as a ‘good pass’. Currently, a grade 4 is the minimum level that students need to reach in English and Maths, otherwise they will need to continue to study these subjects as part of their post-16 education. There is no re-take requirement for other subjects.

When students start in Year 9 they will not be assigned a specific target grade for the end of their course, but instead will be placed into one of the following bandings:

- **Excellent:** Targeted to achieve Grade 9-7 at GCSE
- **Secure:** Targeted to achieve Grade 6-4 at GCSE
- **Developing:** Targeted to achieve grades 3-1 at GCSE
- **Emerging:** Unlikely to grade at GCSE

Staff will assess student progress in line with these bandings and report, via Personal Learning Checklists (PLCs), if a student is on track to achieve within these bands. When students move into Year 10 a specific target grade will be issued for each subject.

Reporting in Year 9 will continue as it has done in Year 8, with subjects issuing PLCs throughout the year, once topics and assignments have been completed. This will inform you and your child of the areas of strength and priority areas for improvement within a topic, as well as indicating how well they are performing against their target band. We will let you know when these have been completed so you know to ask your child how they have done! There will be the Year 9 SPRE in April as well as an end of year summary report.

Launching the L.O.R.I.C. Award: Leadership, Organisation, Resilience, Initiative and Communication

We are delighted to announce some changes to our Personal Development Programme (PDP) from September. We are excited to be launching the **PiXL LORIC Award** accredited through the NCFE (Northern Council for Further Education). This is a framework that will encourage and support students to develop those personal attributes essential for employability and life. The scheme will focus on developing these five key attributes, known by the acronym LORIC:

- Leadership
- Organisation
- Resilience
- Initiative
- Communication

We aim to launch the first level of the programme (PiXL Apprentice Award) with Years 7-10. This will allow all students to familiarise themselves with the platform during 2019-20. Going forward, we expect our Year 7s and 8s to work towards the Apprentice Award and our Year 9s and 10s to move onto the Graduate Award. Students will choose their own set of personalised activities (10 in total, 2 per attribute) to complete the award and will be supported by their tutor in the planning and completion of these.

Year 11 will be involved in Unifrog activities during LORIC sessions, which is a research platform that will ready them for applying to sixth form, apprenticeships or alternative further education providers.

A Risk to Life: Unsafe Cycling

Sadly, we will be starting the process of contacting parents and carers to notify them that their child is banned from bringing a bike to College next academic year. A small number of students are not getting the message about wearing helmets and riding safely and we are sure that parents and carers would be horrified if they saw the danger that students are placing themselves in.

As a College, we cannot knowingly allow our students to put themselves at risk and therefore the privilege of cycling to College will be removed for some. If you do wish your child to cycle to College, please make sure that the message is abundantly clear: they must wear a cycle helmet and they must follow road cycling rules.
