Ace Your Exams: "By failing to prepare, you are preparing to fail"

The clock is ticking, with only 4 school weeks left until the start of the mock exam season for Years 11 and 13. Time spent on revision over half term will be essential. All details of the Year 11 and 13 schedule will be published to students shortly.

<u>Year 11 and 13 Exam Support</u>: This website page contains a range of useful information and tips for exam success including:

GCSE Topics for Revision: This booklet contains all of the topics for all of the GCSE subjects that students will need to revise in preparation for their final examinations. Teachers will indicate which topics need to be revised for mock exams.

Revision Planning Template: This excel workbook maps out all of the days until the summer exams. Students can use it to plan lesson time, revision slots and rest slots. They can plan out their time between now and the mock examinations as a practice for the final exam countdown.

Revision Sessions: Individual subjects are offering a range of revision sessions, including 'Maths Mondays' on a Monday lunchtime. All details can be found on the Year 11 and 13 Exam Support website page.

Ace Your Exams Booklet: This outlines a range of study skills and revision techniques that students can select to support with their revision.

Money Muling: Signs to Look Out For

Northamptonshire Police Force have asked for our help in warning young people about the dangers and consequences of becoming a money mule.

What is a money mule? A money mule is someone who transfers stolen money through their own bank account on behalf of someone else and is paid for doing so. Criminals need money mules to launder the profits of their crimes.

Young people are increasingly being targeted to become money mules. They are approached online or in person, including through social media, at school, college or sports clubs. Sometimes people they know persuade them to take part, often because they are also acting as money mules.

Mules will usually be unaware of where the money comes from – commonly fraud and scams – and that it can go on to fund crimes such as drug dealing and people trafficking.

Being a money mule is illegal: When someone is caught, their bank account will be closed, and they will have problems getting student loans, mobile phone contracts and credit in the future. They could even face arrest for money laundering which carries a maximum sentence of 14 years in prison.

What to look out for: Tell-tale signs that someone might be involved could be them suddenly having extra cash, buying expensive new clothes or top-of-the-range mobile phones and gadgets with very little explanation as to how they got the money. They may also become more secretive, withdrawn or appear under stress.

Staying Safe Online: Password and Email checkers

Over three billion fake emails are sent out each day and many of them are phishing emails aiming to trick people into giving out their passwords and other data, especially for their bank accounts. We continue to empower students to be in control of their digital use. One way to find out whether their email address has ever been comprised is to go to the website 'Have I Been Pwnd' https://haveibeenpwned.com/ and enter the relevant email address.

Another great resource is - 'How secure is my password'. This is a website where you can check how quickly 'hackers' would take to guess your password. https://howsecureismypassword.net/. Experts indicate that rather than making passwords longer, have phrases: 'I use Sainsburys to shop', which using the password strength tester would take 230 septillion years to crack!

Aspiring Medics!

As part of our Raising Aspirations Programme we aim to support students to achieve their dreams. We were delighted to be able to offer two of our Year 10 students the opportunity to attend an "Into Medics Insight Day" at Whittington Hospital, London:

When my grandfather fell foul to a disease which has no cure, I felt enraged that I could do nothing but sit by his side and watch him in pain and confusion. His team of doctors and nurses tried their best yet could not offer any treatment for the cancer of the colon, with metastases spread across the body and dementia, except kind words and paracetamol. This is exactly why I want to pursue a career in medicine, to be the lifeline to a patient and family that has lost hope, the reassuring and listening ear but also a man fighting in the corner of life that will not relent until fighting becomes futile and inhumane. I want to be the person on the battle ground, fighting tooth and nail to prolong life, a cardio-thoracic surgeon.

The "Into Medics Insight Day" allowed me to meet with likeminded people with whom I shared a common goal of a career in medicine. The day included x-ray reading; patient communication and bedside manner; suturing techniques; cannula insertion; a mock 'patient' interview and diagnosis, whom I correctly diagnosed with pneumonia; life beyond medical school and possible career pathways. I can honestly say it was one of the best experiences of my life and I cannot thank the college enough for allowing this to happen.' Euan Warner Year 10

The "Into Medics Insight Day" involved many exciting activities that you will do if you become a doctor and informed us about many things that we should know! It also made me realise how much I want to become a doctor! During the course of the day, we learnt how to suture (stitch) a patient's wound; how to insert a cannula into a patient's arm to give them the correct medications and how to diagnose a patient; and what to do in specific medical situations. We also learnt about life as a Junior Doctor and how to get to that stage!

Preparing for the Future: Northampton University Visit and World Skills UK Live

Indeed, all Year 10 students are being provided with two exciting opportunities! This week they visited the 'UK University and Apprenticeship Search' event at the University of Northampton. Students enjoyed meeting representatives from a wide range of universities and apprenticeship providers, all exhibiting at the beautiful new campus. They were also able to listen to seminars and take a tour of the university.

A student said 'Being at the university has opened my eyes to what I could be doing in the future. I've learnt about the qualifications I'd need to study a course that interests me and got to look at the student accommodation and different study areas.'

On Thursday 21 November we are taking them to the UK's largest interactive apprenticeships, skills and careers event. This exciting event is divided into four industry sectors, with the opportunity to 'have a go' at hands-on, job-related skills across a huge range of careers. Students will experience a wide range of activities, such as TV production, demolition simulation, virtual welding, floristry and 3D modelling and much more! Students will be able to get expert careers advice and meet over 130 employers from across the UK, including BAE Systems, BMW, Coca Cola, HS2, IBM, Muller, NHS Careers, Royal Mail, Toyota and the Armed Forces, many of whom offer jobs, apprenticeships and training opportunities.
