Term 3: Being Ready to Learn

As we turn our attention to Term 3, we will welcome our students back on Monday 6 January at 8.25am (a reminder that our gates close at this time). This will be Week 2 on the timetable.

We would ask that you remind your child that we have reorganised the day so that tutor time will be at the start of the day. Students should head straight for their tutor base on arrival. This is to allow time for tutors to support students to be ready to learn for the start of Term 3. It would be of great help if you could pay particular attention to ensuring that your child:

- Arrives at school by 8.25am each day, before the College gates close. Please note that students who do not arrive by 8.25am will be deemed as late and will be placed in a lunchtime detention;
- Removes any gel or acrylic nails that they may have had done for Christmas ready for the start of the new term, along with any nail varnish;
- Only has up to two pairs of studs in the lobes of their ears. No other piercings are permitted. Please do not allow your child to tell you otherwise and agree to piercings over the Christmas period that will not be acceptable for school!
- Refrains from having lines cut into their hair. These are not permitted. Please do not allow your child to tell you otherwise!
- Switches off their phone and places this in their bag when they arrive at College. If seen out of bags around the College site, phones will be confiscated and a detention will be issued.

January BTEC Examination Season

As we see an end to the recent mock examinations in Years 11 and 13, January sees the Level 3 BTEC exams begin in earnest. BTEC students in Year 13 will be participating in these exams in the first 3 weeks of Term 3 and several of our Level 2 BTEC students will be involved in examinations in Week 5. We wish them every success.

Post LAC, Adopted and Special Guardianship Families

Schools can receive a sum of money each year for a statutory school aged child who has ceased to be looked after by a local authority in England and Wales because of adoption, a special guardianship order, a child arrangements order or a residence order.

The DfE estimate that only around 60% of adoptive parents at primary level inform schools of their child's adoptive status. At secondary level, it is believed even fewer parents inform schools. This means it is quite likely that schools are missing out on funding to which they are entitled.

We are therefore hoping to encourage adoptive parents and guardians to come forward, as there may be support we can offer at school.

The PP Plus Post-LAC funding will be spent on meeting the educational needs of the Post-LAC students and is not a personal budget.
