Learning and Progress

The examination countdown clock has reached zero...

As we knew would happen, all too quickly we have now arrived at the start of the examination season! Many practical exams have taken place and written examinations start on Monday 16 May. Students have been provided with all they need and it is now down to them! All staff are on hand to provide support with well-being over the next few weeks, so if there is anything that your child needs, please do ask.

From today, we will be offering a well-being complimentary breakfast each day from 8.00am for Year 11 and 13 students. Any student is welcome to drop into the Sixth Form centre for something to eat. Staff will be on hand at this time, should students want any support or advice.

Timetable Arrangements:

Year 13: Students are expected to attend normal lessons in a subject until their exams have been completed. Should they have an afternoon exam, they are permitted to study at home for that morning.

Year 11: Students have been issued with their Alternative Timetable, with details of where they should be and when. We would ask that all parents and carers look at this schedule. Normal lessons will continue for as long as is practically possible, and then students move to a blend of examinations, compulsory revision sessions and home study. The <u>Alternative Timetable</u> can be accessed on our website.

Exam Preparation: Please help us to help your child be successful throughout this exam season by:

- Ensuring that they attend all of the revision sessions: these are compulsory!
- Making sure they arrive for the right exams at the right time. Text reminders about exams will be sent to
 parents and carers the day before. Briefing sessions will run for GCSE exams 30 minutes before the start
 times and we would expect all students to attend these.
- Making sure they are dressed in full College uniform / according to the Sixth Form dress code.
- Making sure that they bring water to drink in a clear plastic bottle. Historically we have provided water for students but as we are endeavouring to reduce the use of single use plastics, we will not be in a position to do this, this year. However, we can provide a refilling service outside of the Restaurant and in the Sports Hall on a daily basis.
- Making sure they have all the correct equipment. <u>A plea to please make sure that your child has a calculator for the relevant exams and a compass and protractor for Maths exams! They are putting themselves at a disadvantage should they not have this equipment.</u>

<u>Please remember that students are not allowed any potential technological or web enabled devices,</u> <u>such as mobile phones or smart watches in any examination venues</u>. We request that students leave these at home on exam days along with their mobile phones. If they need to bring them in to College, they must be turned off/removed before the exam, and placed in their bag. Any breaches of this will be reported to the relevant exam board and it is inevitable that disqualification will be a consequence.

Young Minds: Supporting Your Child During Exam Time

- Encourage your child to take revision breaks and find a balance between studying and doing things they find enjoyable and relaxing.
- Make sure they are eating and drinking at regular intervals.
- Reassure them reinforce that you are and will be proud of them, no matter what happens.
- Remain positive and hopeful!
- Let them know their feelings are valid and normal, but also offer support and solutions where possible.
- Anxiety is often worst at night and this means it is useful to encourage a good bedtime routine.

As Year 11 and 13 begin their examinations, we have already launched our **Ace Your Exams** programme for our current Year 10 and 12 students. Year 10 students were issued with revision guides in January, and will shortly be given their Maths revision guides.
