### Educational Provision

#### Remote Education Update

- **Revised TEAMS 'Live' Lessons Timetable:** Following feedback from both students and staff, we have now revised our 'live' TEAMS lessons timetable. We apologise for the update but we now feel that we have a more even spread of lessons, particularly for those students in Years 7 and 8 who will now have at least one 'live' lesson per fortnight in all subjects (with the exception of core PE).

As we are conscious of families who are sharing devices and of screen time for students, generally students in Years 7-11 should expect to attend 3 'live' lessons per day. Due to timetabling, there are occasions when it may be more or less than this.

There has been no change to the Sixth Form timetable, with all lessons still 'live' on TEAMS.

The updated timetables for each year group can be viewed on our [website](#). However, in order to make things easier for students to follow, staff will still indicate on Satchel:one if a lesson is 'live' or independent learning.

Please can we also remind you of the importance of students completing their independent study tasks. These will often be activities to consolidate the learning in the 'live' lessons and if they are not completed, students may fall behind.

- **TEAMS Lessons Protocols:** We have sent a link to students to remind them about the best way to get the most out of 'live' lessons, including the expectations around behaviour, which mirror the expectations in a lesson and those of our [Behaviour for Learning Policy](#).

Students MUST log in with their school account, otherwise they may not be admitted. We have produced a [video](#) guide for them.

- **Remote Education Parent Support:** To help explain how Remote Education should be working we have created a brief parent video which can be [viewed here](#).

We would also encourage you to create an account with Satchel:one and then use this to help monitor the timetable of work for students. Click this [link](#) for details.

- **BBC Teach and Oak National Academy:** You may have seen in the press about these two organisations supporting home learning. Staff may direct students to resources available on both platforms alongside the wealth of other websites we have such as GCSEpod, Seneca and Tassomai. All of these can be used by students if they wish to undertake more activities to consolidate their learning.
- **Tutor Time Activities:** We will be setting students a number of challenges and activities to complete during their usual tutor time. Year 7 have already been set their first Lockdown Challenge: to create a Pangram (they can explain this to you!)

'Quizzy Rascals', our weekly quiz, will also return. We will be using a Kahoot version of 'Quizzy Rascals' on a Wednesday so students can play along at home and compete against their form group. We apologise in advance for any increased noise level in the house at this time!

Thank you to all students who have submitted an application to join our Sixth Form in September. January is always a key time in the transition process to Sixth Form and despite the College being closed, we will continue to offer our programme of support to our Year 11 students.

Therefore, over the next couple of weeks, each student who had submitted an application to join our Sixth Form in September 2021 will receive an invite to attend a 1:1 TEAMS meeting with a member of our Senior Leadership Team. This will provide an opportunity for them to discuss pathway preferences 'face to face'.

We will try to ensure that these meetings do not take place during 'live' TEAMS lessons but it may be necessary for a student to come out of a session to attend a meeting, just as they would have come out of a lesson in school. We will try to avoid this where we can.
