This will be recorded on each PLC. <b>Secure = 40-69%</b>	Knowledge recall questions will be assessed as one mark questions (command words: identify, state, define, draw) on assessments and through ROCK tests that are undertaken twice per term reviewing Core Knowledge taught in the unit of study.
