## Foundation Stage Scheme of Work

## Year 7 Chords Topic 5

## Aims:

This scheme provides students with the opportunity to learn about the theory behind the construction of chords. They will develop their keyboard skills by learning the correct fingering patterns and wrist position for playing chords effectively. Students understanding will be developed through listening, analysis, musical theory and practical exploration through performance.
