# Foundation Stage Scheme of Work

## Year 8 Topic 1 - Africa 14 Lessons

Aims: This unit aims to develop students' understanding of the physical and human characteristics of the continent of Africa. They will map out the different regions and countries within the regions. They will examine the history of Africa as well as some of its physical features. Students will develop their geographical knowledge of different biomes through different locations in Africa and examine how Africa's natural resources can bring challenges, as well as advantages. This unit will cover trends in Africa's population and will focus specifically on the Greater Horn of Africa region, where students will understand the process of urbanisation in Kenya and also different areas of industry, through a case study of flower growing. Students will also explore issues of piracy and how that can be linked to levels of development.

#### **Links To KS3 National Curriculum:**

Students will extend their locational knowledge and deepen their spatial awareness of the world's countries using maps of the world to focus on Africa, focusing on its environmental regions, including hot deserts, key physical and human characteristics, countries and major cities. Students will also understand geographical similarities, differences and links between places through the study of human and physical geography of a region within Africa. This topic also covers human Geography areas of population and urbanisation; international development; economic activity in the primary, secondary, tertiary and quaternary sectors; and the use of natural resources.
