Translation and grammar: These skills will be assessed informally through weekly 'Grammar Guru' tasks. Scores will		
be taken in as with vocabulary tests. (Formative)		
Writing: Regular ALT tasks will be completed throughout the module and structured peer assessment will be used		
to identify areas for improvement. (Summative). Students will also complete a written assessment to test their		
ability to apply key grammar and vocabulary in an exam-style situation. (Formative)		
Speaking: Students will be assessed informally during speaking tasks in class and given individual feedback as		
appropriate. (Formative)
