Delivering high quality learning and teaching through a curriculum that is personalised and designed to meet the needs of each individual learner is a core focus of the College. - High quality, specialised teaching;
- Breadth at KS3, with students experiencing a wide range of subjects, enriched by sports and the Performing Arts;
- Intensive English and Maths catch-up programmes (Ignite) in KS3 for those who need additional support to ensure success with the secondary curriculum;
- Personalised pathways at Key Stage 4, with an offer that includes a range of academic GCSE qualifications and vocational qualifications in a range of subjects;
- Stretch and challenge in each subject for those with exceptional ability;
- A personal development programme delivered through tutor time that actively encourages our students to develop the qualities and skills that will prepare them for life-long success, these being: Leadership, Organisation, Resilience, Initiative and Communication.
