Our Team

As a College, we are passionately committed to Art and Design Technology teaching and the benefits that it brings to our students' personal development. Our curriculum is vibrant and creative and allows our students to explore their imagination through the development of ingenious and thought provoking work.

Our students love our subjects and take a great deal of pride in their achievements: our team thrive on this and find it immensely rewarding.

We are currently a team of 5 specialist teachers and three specialist technicians. The Department is led by a Head of Department (known as Progress Leader) and supported by two Assistant Progress Leaders who share leadership responsibilities between them.

Our Subject Leader (Assistant Progress Leader) Role

We are seeking to appoint a candidate who is passionate about their subject area; a team player who will thrive on collaboration and team work; someone who really wants to make a difference to our creative and vibrant Art and Design Technology Team. The person appointed will have a clear vision of what an outstanding Design and Technology provision looks like and have the skills to lead in this area. We would be particularly interested in a candidate who has knowledge and understanding of Health and Safety in Design and Technology and can lead on this.

We would ideally like to recruit a specialist in the technical principles previously considered as *Resistant Materials*, such as timber and metal based materials, polymers and electronic and mechanical systems. There may be a requirement to teach other Art and Design specialisms and so a candidate who could contribute to Food Technology at KS3 and KS4 and/or Art at KS3 would also be of interest to us.

We are well on the road to being outstanding and are looking for a team member who is passionate about the subject area and who likes to work collaboratively, share resources and wants to join us on our mission to be the best that we can be.

Our Facilities

We have excellent facilities, many of which have been recently refurbished and/or extended. We have five art rooms, one textiles room, one food room, two practical workshops and two computer rooms. The department also has two large ceramic kilns.

Our Curriculum

In Design we currently deliver 3D materials, textiles, graphics, and food and nutrition across KS3 and KS4. Uptake for these subjects at exam level is consistently high.

Within Design, Years 7 and 8 currently follow a carousel system of four rotations every eight weeks, with their progress being tracked across the year as they move through the subject disciplines.

Within the disciplines they study a thematic area of design focusing on the design and manufacture of quality products and the iterative design skills required.

In Food and Nutrition we follow the AQA GCSE specification, the breadth and depth of which also inspires our KS3 schemes of work, offering students an exciting pathway through developing professional practical skills and scientific understanding.

In Art we deliver a series of fresh and exciting schemes of work at KS3 and follow the unendorsed specifications at GCSE and GCE level, offering a broad spectrum of media disciplines. Our Art and Design curriculum at KS4 also offers candidates the opportunity to focus their studies towards a Textiles or Graphics specialism.

Art and Design and Technology students currently study GCSE and GCE qualifications from examining bodies AQA and Edexcel. As a whole, our curriculum looks to cultivate key subject skills through fresh and imaginative teaching and learning.
