### Breaking News: Our students are flying high once again!

We are delighted to be able to share with you some fantastic news about our GCSE Results in August 2019, following the recent release of provisional national data by the Department for Education.

Our Progress 8 Score is provisionally +0.25 and this indicates that our students' progress was above average and places us approximately in the top 30% of schools nationally once again this year.

Well done to our very hard working and committed Class of 2019, who between them secured 60 Grade 9 and 28 Distinction\* grades. Of course, our ambition is to improve even more this year! Year 11, are you up to the challenge?

## Safeguarding

### **Educating our Students to Keep Themselves Safe**

Last week all of our students took part in Safeguarding assemblies where they had the opportunity to learn about key safeguarding issues, how to keep safe and where to get help. Students were exceptionally receptive and mature with this very serious content. During the assembly we covered key themes including County Lines, Child Sexual Exploitation and Digital Safety.

We seek to ensure that students are always kept up to date with the most current news: this year the new Voyeurism Act came into force and alleged offences will be put before the courts with a maximum 2-year prison sentence:

"The Voyeurism (Offences) Act 2019 creates 2 new offences criminalising someone who operates equipment or records an image under another person's clothing (without that person's consent or a reasonable belief in their consent) with the intention of viewing, or enabling another person to view, their genitals or buttocks (with or without underwear), where the purpose is to obtain sexual gratification or to cause humiliation, distress or alarm."
